Proviso.

III. PROVIDED NEVERTHELESS, That in case any party to such suit shall conceive himself properly relievable in equity on such case, it shall and may be lawful for such person to proceed in chancery.

C H A P. VII.

C H A P. VIII.
An ACT declaring the rights of three lots, originally laid out in Annapolis, for the uses therein mentioned. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 390.

C H A P. IX.
An ACT to confirm to Mary Hall, of Talbot county, widow, a tract of land called Glade's Addition, in Talbot county. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 392. A Private Act.

C H A P. X.
An ACT to limit the continuance of actions in several courts within this province, and ascertaining the manner of taking the evidence of seafaring men, and for granting appeals from the chancery court to the governor and council. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 394. Repealed by 1721, ch. 14.

C H A P. XI.
An ACT for supplying defects in the conveyance of land from John Carey, John Burrige and George Cole, to Peregrine Brown, marchant, deceased. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 395. A Private Act.

C H A P. XII.
An ACT to enable Benjamin Howard to sell certain lands in Anne Arundel county, and for the entailing other lands belonging to the said Benjamin, in Baltimore county. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 397. A Private Act.

C H A P. XIII.
An ACT for the removing the court-house from Charles-town, in Prince-George's county, and for the building a court-house for the said county at the town of Marlborough, in the said county, and for making sale of the old court-house and prison. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 399.

C H A P. XIV.
An ACT for confirming the last will and testament of Elizabeth Devegh, late of Baltimore county, deceased, and for vesting in John Devegh, his heirs and assigns for ever, an estate in fee-simple in all and singular the lands, tenements and hereditaments, whereof the said Elizabeth Devegh died seized as aforesaid. C H A P. XV.
An ACT for investing the right heirs of Edward Day, late of Somerset county, with an estate in fee-simple of certain lands in the said county. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 403. A Private Act.

C H A P. XVI.
An ACT for the better supporting the magistrates in the administration of justice within this province, and for the disabling Thomas Macnemara, Esquire, to practise the law therein. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 404.

C H A P. XVII.
An ACT for the relief of Robert High, bricklayer, a languishing prisoner in Calvert county, and of Philip Eilbeck, in Kent county. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 407. A Private Act.

C H A P. XVIII.
An ACT for ascertaining the bounds of land within this province. Lib. LL. No. 4. fol. 410. Dissent.

C H A P. XIX.
An ACT for settling all disputes concerning the boundaries of the several lots within the city of Annapolis, and confirming the same to the respective takers up, improvers and purchasers thereof, and for laying out ten acres of land out of the town pasture into twenty lots more, to be added to the said city.
