the time being then furviving and remaining within the county, or the major part of them, be and are hereby authorized and required to elect, nominate and choose, one or more of the principal and better fort of the inhabitants of the county into the place and room of the said visitors of such school so dead or removed, and to to all up the full number of visitors for each school, the which persons, so elected and chosen from time to time, are always to be qualified in the same manner as is before mentioned.

VII. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the vilitors (for the time being) of each school, being Land to be purqualified as aforefaid, be and are hereby authorifed and directed, with all convenient speed, to purchased, &c. chase one hundred acres or more of land, for the use of such school, having a special regard as to its conveniency, that it be as near as possible in such place in the county as is before directed for the erecting of schools by this act, the which land, when so purchased the visitors are to assign such part of it as they shall see meet, not to exceed one moiety thereof, to be built upon and cleared, (if not before built on and cleared,) for the conveniency of making corn and grain, and for passuage, for the encouragement, use and benefit of the master of such school for the time being, the other moiety whereof is to be preserved in woodland ground, and no other use made thereof by such master, without the licence and direction of the faid vilitors, than what may be ablolutely necessary for firewood, and the repairing of the houses and fencing already huilt and made, or to be hullt and made, on such other moiety thereof, and that no master be permitted, either by himself or by any other person, on any pretence what loever, to plant any tobacco on such land or plantation; and the visitors of the several schools as aforesaid, are surther empowered and directed, in case that there shall not be sufficient building apon any fuch land at the time of making a purchase thereof for a dwelling-house, and necessary conveniencies for the master, and for keeping a school therein, and ground cleared sufficient for the use aforesaid, that then they shall, with all possible speed, agree with such workmen and labourers, or other person, in the best manner they can that will undertake the necessary buildings and improvements upon fuch lands for the uses afore-mentioned; and the vilitors aforesaid are likewife hereby directed to take all proper methods for the encouraging good schoolmasters, that shall be members of the church of England, and of pious and exemplary lives and convertations, and capable of teaching well the grammar, good writing, and the mathematicks, if such can conveniently be got, and that they allow every such master for his encouragement for the present the benefit and use of his plantation,) the sum of twenty pounds per annum, and to take such other measures, or make fuch other agreements, from time to time, for the future, as the circumstances will admit of, as may give due encouragement to one or more masters, and be necessary and useful for the improving and perpetuating fuch school.

VIII. And, further, The visitors of every school, after it shall be erected are hereby required Visitors to to meet theread at leaft four times a year, to inspect into and consider of and direct the necessary meet, &c. affairs thereof.

IX. AND, for the enabling the vilitors of the schools as aforefaid for the purchasing of lands, and erecting of schools, and encouraging of masters in manner as aforesaid, BE IT ENACTED, That the Schools to have money already railed for the use of county schools, and that is now in the public treasurer's hands, &c. being divided into (a) twelve equal parts, answering to the number of country schools now to be erected, the treasurers, in whose hands such money lies, are pereby required to make due payment of one of those twelve parts or dividends of money in their hands to the visitors of the schools for each county, or, the major part of them, or their orders, whenfoever they shall have occasion to draw on such treasurers for the same, and the like payment shall, from time to time, he made to the visitors as aforesaid, by the treasurers, of the like dividends that shall hereafter arise due to such schools, and come to their hands; and the vilitors of the schools as aforefaid, are hereby empowered to difpole of all fuch money as they shall receive from time to time, in such manner as may be most for the encouragement and advancement of such schools.

(a) By 1746, ch. 7, a school was erected in Worcester county, and the whole directed to be divided into 13 parts, of which the new credted school to have one part.

X. AND BE IT LIKEWISE ENACTED, Phat the visitors of each school, to be constituted, qualified Visitors to hold and incorporated in manner aforefaid, or the major part of them; and their successors, be and are lands, &c. hereby enabled to take, hold and enjoy, and be apt and capable in law for taking, holding and enjoying, all manors, lands, tenements, inheritances, franchifes and possessions whatsoever, spiritual or temporal, to the value of fifteen hundred pounds sterling, and all other goods, chattels, money and personal estate whatsoever, of the gift of any person whatsoever, that already liath, or hereaster shall be willing to bestow them for the use of the said schools, or any other gifts, grants, assignments, legacies or appointments of the same, or any of them, or any other goods whatsoever, to be applied
