

C H A P. XXII.
 Passed 1st of Nov. 1728. An ACT for the better regulating the parishes in St. Mary's and Charles counties. Lib. L. No. 5. fol. 242.

N. B. By this act, certain commissioners were appointed for regulating the several parishes in the said counties, and dividing the same by natural or artificial boundaries, &c. and to return their proceedings to the next general assembly, for their inspection and approbation; and an act was passed 1729, ch. 14, in pursuance thereof, but dissented to by his Lordship.

C H A P. XXIII.
 An ACT to prevent the abuses of concealing convicted felons, and other offenders, imported into this province, and for the better discovery of them. Lib. L. No. 5. fol. 244.

C H A P. XXIV.
 Passed 2d of Nov. 1728. A Supplementary act to the act for relieving the inhabitants of this province from some aggrievances in the prosecution of suits at law. Lib. L. No. 5. fol. 249.

 An ACT for the repairing and enlarging of the church in the city of Annapolis, and for the building a chapel of ease in the parish of St. Anne's, in Anne-Arundel county, and to empower the raising and levying a quantity of tobacco for that purpose. Lib. L. No. 5. fol. 250.

1729. Preamble. WHEREAS at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis *anno* 1707, there was an act passed to prevent, amongst other things, the clipping of all sorts of foreign coins, but
