

C H A P. XXXI.

An ACT for laying an imposition of three-pence per hoghead on all tobacco to be exported out of this province for the (a) time therein mentioned. Lib. BLC. fol. 63. Passed 8th of August, 1732.

C H A P. XXXII.

An ACT for the relief of Alexander Sims and Archibald Johnson, languishing prisoners in St. Mary's county gaol. Lib. BLC. fol. 64. A Private Act.

C H A P. XXXIII.

An ACT empowering a committee to lay, assess and apportion the public levy for this present year, one thousand seven hundred and thirty-two. Lib. BLC. fol. 66.

C H A P. XXXIV.

An ACT for the continuance of St. Mary's county court, Baltimore county court, and Talbot county court, from the first Tuesday of August until the first Tuesday of November next, and for the further continuance of causes in the said courts. Lib. BLC. fol. 66.

At a SESSION of ASSEMBLY begun and held at the City of ANNAPOLIS, in the county of Anne-Arundel, for the province of Maryland, on the 13th day of March, in the 18th year of the dominion of the right honourable CHARLES, absolute Lord and Proprietary of the provinces of Maryland and Avalon, Lord Baron of Baltimore, &c. *annoque domini 1732*, and ended the 12th day of April following, *anno domini 1733*, the following laws were enacted and assented to, by

C H A P. I.

An ACT reviving an act of assembly entitled, (b) An act for the speedy and effectual publication of the laws of this province, and for the encouragement of William Parks, of the city of Annapolis, printer. Lib. BLC. fol. 68. Passed 12th of April, 1733.

(b) 1727, ch. 8, hereby continued seven years.

C H A P. II.

A Supplementary act to the act, entitled, \* An act for laying out anew fifteen acres of land, part of the one hundred acres of land formerly erected into a town, commonly called Benedict-Leonard-town, upon Patuxent river, in Charles county, besides the lots which have been already taken up, pursuant to the directions of former laws, and to restrain the inhabitants from keeping any stock, except within their enclosure, in the said town. Lib. BLC. fol. 69. \* 1732, ch. 25

N. B. By this act, 1. The owner of the land was obliged to make his first choice of one lot within ten days after notice given him by the commissioners, &c. 2. The tobacco set upon the lots might be paid by the several takers up to the owner of the land, either at his dwelling-house, or in the hands of the sheriff of Charles county. 3. No persons living within the said town shall keep therein, or within the enclosures of Mr. Charles Somerset Smith, any hogs, geese, horses, cows or other cattle, belonging to themselves or others, unless within their own enclosures, and persons convicted thereof before a single magistrate, on confession or proof, shall pay one hundred pounds tobacco for each transgression, to be levied on the body, goods, &c. of the offender, by way of execution, as in case of small debts, to be applied to the use of the county free-school.
