An ACT for the indemnity of such persons as shall be employed in transporting his majesty's troops, to be raised in this province, to the general rendezvous in the West-Indies. Lib. BLC. fol. 204. Passed 26th of July, 1740.

C. H. A. P. IV.  
An ACT for the speedy and effectual publication of the laws of this province, and for the encouragement of Jonas Green, of the city of Annapolis, printer. Lib. BLC. fol. 205. Passed 29th of July, 1740.  
To continue in force till the last day of December, 1742. Expired.

C. H. A. P. V.  
An ACT reviving an act of assembly of this province, entitled, (a) An act to prevent cutting up tobacco plants, destroying tobacco and tobacco-houses, and for ascertaining the punishment of criminals guilty of the said offences. Lib. BLC. fol. 207.  
(a) 1732, ch. 8, hereby continued three years, &c.

C. H. A. P. VI.  
An ACT continuing an act of assembly of this province, entitled, (b) An act for the more effectual punishment of certain offenders, and for taking from them the benefit of clergy. Lib. BLC. fol. 207.  
(b) 1737, ch. 2, hereby continued three years, &c.

C. H. A. P. VII.  
An ACT continuing an act of assembly of this province, entitled, (c) A supplementary act to the act, entitled, An act for the more effectual punishment of negroes and other slaves, and for taking away the benefit of clergy from certain offenders, and to an act, entitled, An act to prevent the tumultuous meeting and other irregularities of negroes and other slaves, and directing the manner of trying slaves. Lib. BLC. fol. 208.

C. H. A. P. VIII.  
An ACT reviving an act, entitled, (d) An act to prevent the injuring harbours within this province, and for repealing the act therein mentioned. Lib. BLC. fol. 209.

C. H. A. P. IX.  
An ACT reviving an act, entitled, (e) A supplementary act to the act, entitled, An act laying an imposition on negroes, and several sorts of liquors imported, and also on Irish servants, to prevent the importing too great a number of Irish papists into this province. Lib. BLC. fol. 209.  
(e) 1735, ch. 6, hereby continued three years, &c.

C. H. A. P. X.  
An ACT for reviving an act of assembly of this province, entitled, (f) An act ascertaining the gauge and tare of tobacco hogheads, and to prevent cutting, cropping and defacing tobacco taken on board ships or vessels upon freight. Lib. BLC. fol. 210.  
(f) 1739, ch. 9, hereby continued three years, &c.

C. H. A. P. XI.  
An ACT for the benefit of the poor, and encouragement of industry. Lib. BLC. fol. 210.  
To remain in force for three years. Continued by 1744, ch. 19, and expired July, 1747.

C. H. A. P. XII.  
An ACT for the relief of Samuel Deavor, a languishing prisoner in Anne-Arundel county gaol, Michael Taylor, a languishing prisoner in Prince-George's county gaol, William Burros, a languishing prisoner in Kent county gaol, James Carter, a languishing prisoner in Cecil county gaol, Sarah Butcher, a languishing prisoner in Dorchester county gaol, and William Biggs, a languishing prisoner in St. Mary's county gaol.
