C H A P.

An ACT to raise a sum of money for the payment of the officers Passed 15th of Jan. 1783. and foldiers of the line of this state from the first day of August, feventeen hundred and eighty, to the first day of January, seventeen hundred and eighty-one. Lib. TBH. No. A. fol. 281.

HEREAS this general affembly are very defirous of raifing a fum in specie, to discharge the Preamble. pay due to the officers and foldiers of the line of this state from the first day of August, seventeen hundred and eighty-one;

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the intendant of the revenue be Intendant to authorifed and directed to fell any of the specifics on hand, or to be received in virtue of the act to fell specifics, raise the supplies for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-two, (1) and not heretofore specially &c. appropriated by law, as he may think proper, and on the best terms he can procure; and that the faid intendant be also authorised to direct the commissioners appointed to preserve confiscated British property to dispose of any British property heretosore appropriated for the redemption of the last emission, and not already fold, and any other British property not appropriated by law, and not charged with confiderable debts, as he may think proper, and to fell the same at auction or private fale, as the faid intendant may think most adviseable; and the said commissioners shall consult with and take the directions of the intendant as to the price; and the faid property shall be fold on the following terms, to wit: That on the day of fale, (or within five days thereafter, if so agreed by the commissioners,) the purchaser shall give bond in current money, with good security, in double the purchase money, conditioned for payment to the state of one third in thirty days, one other third in

two
