

merchant grist mills, forges, furnaces, stills and fulling mills, were not valued to the owners, under pretext that they were excepted from taxation by the exception in the said act, "of the working tools of mechanics and manufacturers," and such conduct in the assessors and commissioners was contrary to the letter, spirit and intention of the said act; C H A P. XXXIV.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all mills, stills, forges and furnaces, be valued agreeable to the act of this session to raise the supplies for the current year, and that such valuation be immediately thereafter collected by the collectors of the tax from the owners of such mills or furnaces which were not valued this present year. Mills, &c. to be valued, &c.

III. AND, whereas from the extent and situation of some of the counties of this state, it may be very convenient to the people, and not injurious to the public interest, that two places should be appointed in such county for the receipt of specifics, BE IT ENACTED, That the intendant of the revenue be authorized to appoint one other place on water navigation in such county, besides the one named in the act to raise the supplies for the current year, and thereupon any specifics may be received at such place. A place to be appointed, &c.

IV. AND, as it is the duty of every citizen to pay the taxes imposed by the legislature by the time and in the manner prescribed, and that those who neglect may be known and distinguished, BE IT ENACTED, That the collectors of the tax in the several counties be directed and required, under the penalty of fifty pounds current money, on or before the tenth day of June next, to make out an alphabetical list of all persons who shall pay the tax with which their property is chargeable before the first day of the same month of June next, and to lodge, before the said tenth day of June, one copy of such list with the clerk of their county court, and to send one other copy thereof, by the first conveyance, to the intendant of the revenue; and the said collectors are also hereby directed and required, in the same manner, and under the same penalty, to make out and set up as aforesaid, on or before the tenth day of July next, and on or before the tenth day of every month thereafter, until all the taxes due in the county be collected, a similar list of those who shall have paid on the first day of each month, and to transmit a copy of such list as before directed. Collectors to make a list, &c.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That so much of the act, * entitled, An act to raise the supplies for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-three, as imposes a tax or assessment of fifteen shillings on married men not liable to be assessed the sum of fifty pounds current money or upwards, be and is hereby repealed. * Chapter 6. Part of an act repealed.

VI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That where any person shall deliver specifics at any of the places appointed for the receipt thereof, out of the county where the tax arises, that the commission shall be equally divided between the person receiving the same and the collector of the county where such tax arises. Commission to be divided.
