C H A P. XXIV

An ACT appointing wardens for the port of Baltimore-town, in Baltimore county. Lib. TBH. No. A. fol. 310.

Supplementary and other acts November, 1788, ch. 20, 1791, ch. 60.

THEREAS it is of importance to the state, that proper persons should be impointed to pre- Preamble.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Samuel Smith, Daniel Bowley, John Wardens to be Sterett, Samuel Purviance, Thomas Russell, Richard Ridgely, Robert Henderson, Thomas Elliot appointed, &c. and William Patterson, be and are hereby appointed wardens for the faid port of Baltimore-town, in Baltimore county, till the first Monday in October, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-fix, and no longer, unless elected agreeably to the manner hereafter prescribed; and, faid wardens and their fuccessors are hereby invested with full hower and authority to carry into effect the feveral objects and intentions of this act; and it shall and may be lawful for them, or a majority of them; the chairman herein after directed to be chosen being one, as soon as conveniently may be, having first taken the oath or qualification hereafter prescribed, to meet together, at such times as are herein after mentioned, for the executing and performing the duties hereby enjoined; and faid wardens shall have power to appoint and employ a skilful person to be their clerk, who shall keep fair minutes and entries of all their orders, regulations and transactions, and shall, before he enters on the duties of his office, give good and, sufficient fecurity, for its faithful discharge, in the fum of one hundred pounds, to be approved of by fail wardens; all which faid minutes and entries thall be public, and submitted to the inspection of any person or persons who shall defire to peruse them, he or they paying to the clerk the sum of one shilling for each time the books shall be examined; and that the faid clerk shall give true copies of any such entries or minutes made in the faid books,

less than twelve words; and the said wardens are hereby empowered to have and use one common

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the electors for special commissioners shall, on the first Monday To be elected of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-fix, and the first Monday of every five October in every fifth year, for ever after, ballot for nine wardens, in the same manner as directed for years, &c. faid special commissioners by the act, (a) entitled, An act for the more effectual paving the streets of Baltimore-town; in Baltimore county, and for other purposes, and shall fignify the election of said wardens in the public news-paper; that the aforesaid electors, before they proceed to the election for wardens, shall take an oath or affirmation, to elect, without favour or partiality, fuch persons for wardens, as they in their judgment and conscience believe best qualified for said office; that the perfons elected wardens must have been residents in the laid town three whole years preceding the election, and must have real or personal property in faid town above the value of one thousand pounds and that vacancies happening from death, refufal, disqualification or resignation, be filled up by the wardens, in the manner directed in the aforesaid act for filling up vacancies of special commissioners for faid town. 经检验证据证明的证据
