

C H A P. XXXV. Agent to be appointed, &c.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the governor and council be authorized, and requested to appoint and commission in the name and behalf of this state, some sensible, discreet person, full abilities and address, to be agent and trustee, to execute the several trusts, powers and authorities, to him committed, in virtue and pursuance of this act; and the governor and council are requested, on making such appointment, to take bond from the said agent and trustee, with good security, or from other persons on his behalf, in the penalty of eighty thousand pounds current money, conditioned for the faithful execution of the trust reposed in such agent by this act.

To pay bills of exchange, &c.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said agent be authorized, and he is hereby required, to pay the bills of exchange drawn by the treasurer of the state, in virtue of the act of assembly, entitled, An act for calling out of circulation certain bills of credit emitted by act of assembly, passed at November session, in the year seventeen hundred and seventy-nine.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That an act of assembly, entitled, A Supplement to the act for the regulation of the staple of tobacco, made at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis on Tuesday the seventeenth day of October, seventeen hundred and eighty, (a) and an additional supplement to the act for the regulation of the staple of tobacco, made at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis on Thursday the tenth day of May, seventeen hundred and eighty-one, (b) be and they are hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force until the end of the next session of assembly; that all those parts of one other act of assembly, entitled, An act concerning estates tail, and the jurisdiction of the county courts, made at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis on Tuesday the fifteenth day of June, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-three, (c) which relate to the jurisdiction of the county courts, be and they are hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force until the end of the next session of assembly.
