III And HE IT ENACTED, That the members of the faid corporation, and their successors, may CHAP meet together on the fourth Tuesday in May every year, and at such other time or times, and at May meet anfuch-place or places within this state, and upon such public notice given, as may be fixed and agreed nually, &c. upon, for the purpoles of forming such rules and regulations as may be necessary for answering and carrying into effect the pious purpoles of this act, provided fuch rules and regulations be not repugnant to the constitution and laws of this state.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED. That the faid corporation, and their flicceffors, by the name aforefaid, May fue, &c. shall be for ever hereaster able and capable, in law to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, answer and be answered unto, defend and be defended, in all or any courts of justice, and before all or any judges; officers, or other persons whatsoever, in all and singular actions, matters and demands whatsoever, and that it shall and may be lawful for them, and their successors, for ever hereaster, to have a common feal for their use; and in their affairs and business, and the same, at the will and pleasure of them, and their fuccellors, to change, alter, break and make anew, from time to time, as they shall think best, and shall in general! have and exercise all such rights, franchises, privileges and immunities, as by law are incident and necessary to corporations of this kind, and which may be necessary to the corporation herein and hereby constituted and erected, to enable them duly and fully, in the law, the execute all things (touching and concerning the delign and intentiof their faid incorporation, for the benefit, fuccour and relief, of the widows of fuch, clergyment in the orders and communion of the protestant episcopal church aforefuid, as may or stiall become contributors to the funds of the faid corporation, agreeable to fuch rules and by-laws as may be ellablished for the management and payment of annuities to the fuld widows, and for the education of their children, and fettling them in fome ufeful bulinels or profellion.

ELIT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the intendant of the revenue be au-Papers to be Children and celivered, &c. eighty-fix, to call on all persons having confiscated British property in their possession, or the title papers thereof or relating thereto, to discover, make known, and deliver up the same; and if the faid intendant has, probable and good ground to fuspect, that any person holds the same in trust for any British fubject, or conceals the same, or any deeds, writings, or evidence of the title to such property, he may and shall direct the attorney-general to file a bill in the high court of chancery, on behalf of this state, for the discovery of fuch trust or concealed property, and for delivering up such deeds, writings, and evidence of title to the same, and thereupon proceedings shall be had, and decree made, according to the rules of the high court of chancery in fuch cases.

II. AND BE IT ENACTED, That if any person having possession of any confiscated British property, Forfeiture on and not having a fair claim of title thereto, or having obtained the possession of any property formerly belonging to any British subject, in virtue of any gift, grant, sale, devise or conveyance, made or executed fince the nineteenth of April, seventeen hundred and seventy-five, and before the first of December, onesthousand seven hundred and seventy-nine, by any person declared to be a British subject by the act to feize, confiscate and appropriate, all British property within this state, with intent and design to cover and protect such property from confiscation, or by any conveyance, gift, grant, sale or devile made fince the first of December, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-nine, by any person declared a British subject as aforesaid, not bond fide in pursuance of some contract or agreement made before that day in writing, or for the just payment of a debt due before that day by the person making fuch grant, conveyance or fale, to the person receiving the same, and shall not discover the same property, and the circumstances under which the same is held, and deliver up the same and the title
