BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That any seven or more visitors and governors of the said college, if chosen on or before the first day of March next, together with any four or more of the agents, appointed in virtue of the said act, shall be, and hereby are authorised and directed, to do and perform all such acts and things, as by the act for founding the said college might have been done and performed if seven or more visitors and governors had been chosen on or before the first day of June last.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That any nine visitors and governors, chosen and elected agreeably to the said act, shall be, and hereby are, authorised and directed to do and perform all such acts and things as thirteen visitors and governors might have done by virtue of the said act, if they had been chosen before the said sirk day of June last.

Preamble.

A Supplement to the act, entitled, * An act for establishing a company for opening and extending the navigation of the river Pa-

towmack. Lib. TBH. No. A. fol. 591.

THEREAS the president and directors of the Patowinack company, by their humble petition to this general assembly, and the general assembly of the commonwealth of Virginia, on behalf of the faid company, have fet forth, that in pursuance of the acts of assembly of the commonwealth of Virginia, and this state, entitled, An act for establishing a company for opening and extending the navigation of the river Patowmack, they purpose to make a canal on one level, to be supplied by the current of the river from a little above the Great Falls of Patowmack to a convenient place below those falls, where they design to effect a communication with the bed of the river by connected locks, and that they are under the strongest impressions, if any canal and locks should be found necessary or useful at the Little Falls of the said river, that another such cut on one level, and a walte of the whole fall by a fet of locks at tide water, will be preferable there on every account; and that as the depth of the water in such canals will be increased on the rife of the water in the river, so as to permit an easy passage for all such boats and rasts as can pass in the river, even less than two feet depth of water in the faid canals in dry seasons, with the certain necessary increase on the rife of the river, will be fully sufficient, instead of the four feet required by the said acts, to answer all useful purposes, and that cutting the said canals four feet below the level of the water in dry feafons, will very greatly and ufefully enhance the expence of the canals, occasion confiderable delay in the work, and render it in a degree less secure; and have therefore prayed, that acts of both affemblies may pass, making it necessary that such canals contain two only, instead of the four feet required by the faid acts, or that if the level fliould be broke by locks placed apart from each other,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That any canal which shall be cut or made on one level by the Patowmack company at the Great or Little Falls of Patowmack river, supplied by the current of that river, containing two feet depth of water at the least in dry seasons, and communicating again with the river by locks, if necessary, the spaces between the locks, if they should be placed distant from each other, containing four feet depth of water, shall be equally available to every intent and purpose, and the said company shall be entitled to the same tolls, and shall have all the rights whatsoever, as if the whole of such canals had been made to contain four feet depth of water, agreeable to the directions of the said acts, any thing in the said acts to the contrainty notwithstanding.
