till it interlects the main road leading from King's branch to Princels-Anne, and that the commission Sners, or any two of them, be and they are hereby authorifed and directed to open and lay out the faid road agreeably to the prayer of the faid recited petition, and that the faid road be twenty feet wide, and when opened and laid out by the commissioners, or any two of them, agreeably to this act, be deemed, taken and established, to all intents and purposes, as a public road.

C H A P. XX.

A Supplement to an act, entitled, An, act to establish a road in March, 1786. Worcester county from the Sinepuxent road to Walton Purnell 1784, ch. 4. and Annanias Hudson's grist mill, and from thence to Freeman's

THEREAS the aforesaid Walton Purnell and Annanias Hudson, together with the inhabitants Freamble. generally of the upper part of the county aforesaid, did, by their humble petition to the last general affembly, for forth, that there had been a road for a long time in the faid county, leading from the Sinepuxent road to the mill of Walton Purnell and Annanias Hudson, but that the said road never having been made a public road by law, they were deprived of the benefit of the faid road, to their great injury and inconvenience; and it appeared to the general assembly that the facts were true, and that the prayer of the faid petition ought to be granted, in confideration of which it was enacted, by the general assembly of Maryland, that Thomas Purnell, Wellop's Neck, James Quinton, William Ironshire, Parker Selby, Brick-house, and Isaac Marshall, or any three or more of them, flould be thereby authorifed and empowered, to lay out a public road, twenty feet wide, from the faid Sinepuxent road, that is, the road leading from Saint-Martin's church to Sinepuxent inlet, to the grift mill of the faid Annanias Hudson and Walton Purnell, and from the faid mill to Freeman's branch; by which it was enacted, that the faid road when made should be a public road, and kept up at the public expence, and also that the commissioners, or any three or more of them, should ascertain and value what damage might be occasioned to any person or persons by such road passing through his, her or their land, which damage, when afcertained, should be paid to such person or persons by the faid Annanias Hudson and Walton Purnell: And whereas it appears to this general assembly, by the humble petition of Walton Purnell and Annanias Hudson, that they are not more benefitted by the said road than the rest of the community, nor more desirous of the same, and the original petition must have been misconceived, or the matter misropresented; therefore,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all that part of an act, made and Part of an act passed at a session of assembly begun and held at the city of Annapolis on Monday the first day of repealed. November, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-four, which directs, that Annanias Hudson and Walton Purnell shall pay the damages that may be occasioned to any person or persons by such road passing through his, her or their land, is hereby repealed.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the justices of Worcester county court, at their next levy court, Damages to be shall levy upon the affessable property of the inhabitants of said county the sum so adjudged by the commissioners aforesaid to be the damages sustained by the persons through whose lands the road as aforesaid shall run, and such sum, when collected, shall be paid to the persons sustaining such da-
