BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the governor of this state for the time being shall be entitled to receive at the rate of one thousand pounds current money for his salary, and the same shall be paid quarterly out of the annual supplies until the general assembly shalf provide particular funds for payment.

Preamble.

THEREAS Thomas Harwood, the third, John Smith Brookes, Rinaldo Johnson, Elisha Berry, John Warring and Richard Smith, fecurities of Thomas Williams, deceased, late collector of the tax and public dues in Prince-George's county, have, by their humble petition; fet forth to the general affembly, that with every exertion of the powers heretofore granted to them, they have not been able to complete the collection of the arrears and balances due to the faid Thomas Williams, for want of timely returns from the deputies of the faid Thomas Williams, and on account of certain. injurious practices of fome of the faid deputies in the manner of their giving receipts, and by reason also of the pernicious practice of replevying goods taken in execution: And whereas it is reasonable that those who are reduced by an act of benevolence to the hard condition of being obliged to anfwer for the failure, milmanagement and indifferention, of another perion, are entitled to every indulgence which can be granted without detriment to the public: And whereas it is doubtful whether: the powers heretofore granted to the faid fecurities have not expired,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the powers granted to Thomas Harwood, the third, John Smith Brookes, Rinaldo Johnson, Elisha Berry, John Warring and Richard. Smith, by an act, entitled, An act to authorife and empower the securities of Thomas Williams, deceased, late collector of the tax and public dues in Prince-George's county, to complete the same, be and are hereby continued in the faid Thomas Harwood, the third, John Smith Brookes, Rinaldo, Johnson, Elisha Berry, John Warring and Righard Smith, or a majority of them; and the commissioners of the tax for Prince-George's county for the time being shall, when called on by the securities. of Thomas Williams, or a majority of them, execute the powers in them vested by the aforesaid act; and that all matters and things done by the faid fecurities, or the commissioners of the tax, since the first day of November last, in the exercise of the said powers, shall be as good, effectual and unimpeachable in law, as if done before the faid day.

III. And, whereas the faid fecurities have, by their petition further fet forth, that they find, after their utmost exertions, and the fullest collection they shall be able to make of said arrears; they will fustain a heavy and capital loss, and beg that they may be permitted to fell on credit, under their own management, fuch parts of their property as they may think proper, for covering the fame; therefore, BE IT ENACTED, That the faid securities, or either of them, be and are hereby vested with full powers and authority to sell and dispose of such part or parts of their property as they may think proper, for the purpose of discharging the debt aforefaid, in as full and ample a manner as if he or they had not become fecurity for the faid Thomas Williams as collector aforefaid, and upon the fale of fuch property by the securities, or either of them, to take bond to the state from the purchaser or purchasers, with such security as the commissioners of the tax of Prince-George's county, or a majority of them, shall approve of, for double the purchase money, with condition, that the same shall be paid in current money, or in specie certificates heretofore issued by this state, or to be issuedfor any debt now due from this state, on or before the first day of January, seventeen hundred and nincty, and legal interest thereon, payable as aforesaid annually and punctually at the end of every year, until the principal be paid; and that in such case, the treasurer of the western shore, in behalf
