II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the faid rector, governors, trustees and visitors, of King William's school, shall meet at their usual place of meeting on the twentyfecond day of February, in the prefent year leventeen hundred and eighty-fix, or on any other day meet, &c. thereafter; as shall be by them appointed, and appoint a committee of their own body, consisting of five persons, to meet the visitors and governors of Saint-John's college, or a committee thereoff to confer and treat with them on the terms and conditions upon which the funds and property belonging to the faid school shall be conveyed to the faid visitors and governors of Saint-John's college; and if the faid committees shall agree on the terms and conditions, the same shall be reported at a meeting of the rector, governors, trustees and visitors of King William's school, at which meeting every member on that day in the city of Annapolis shall have notice to attend, and if the said terms and conditions shall be approved by eleven members, they, or any eleven of the faid body corporate, may, by a deed executed and acknowledged before the general court, or any judge thereof, or the county court of Anne-Arundel, or any two justices thereof, and recorded within fix months of the date among the records of the general court of the western shore, or the records of Anne-Arundel county, grant and convey unto the vifitors and governors of Saint-John's college, and their fuccesfors, all the lands, chattels, and choses in action, and property belonging to the faid school, upon the terms and condition to be agreed on and ratified as aforefaid, and fuch deed shall be sufficient to pals the faid property; and the faid vilitors and governors of Saint-John's college shall thereupon have full power to fue by the name of their own body corporate, and to recover all things to which the faid school now has a right, and which shall have conveyed as aforesaid; the said visitors and governors to be named as affiguees whenever they shall prosecute an action upon a bond.

III. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That in case the terms or conditions upon which the pro- In certain cases perty aforesaid may be agreed to be transferred be broken and not complied with by the said visitors property to reand governors of Saint-John's college, then the faid property shall revest in the rector, governors, trustees and visitors of King William's school, in the same manner and to the same uses, intents and purposes, as they now hold the same; and if, at the time of breaking the said terms and conditions, it shall happen that there shall not be a sufficient number of the said rector, governor, trustees and visitors, living, or if those living shall decline to act, so that there shall not be a sufficient number to hold and apply the faid property, and to exercise the powers they now have, the governor and council for the time being shall appoint so many proper persons to be rector, governors, trustees and visitors; as shall make up the number at this time by law empowered to act; and if at the time of fuch breach of terms and conditions, or after fuch breach and before any act shall be done, it shall happen that none of the present rector, governors, trustees and visitors shall be living, or if all shall decline to act, then the faid property shall be vested in the governor and council for the time being, and their successors, who shall, without delay, appoint a sufficient number of proper persons to be rector, governors, trustees and visitors, of the faid school, who shall receive and take the faid property, to be held, managed and used, by them and their successors, for the uses, intents and purposes, for which it was originally granted; and the perfons fo to be appointed shall perform the same duties, and have the same powers, as the present body corporate at this time perform and enjoy; and those persons who shall, upon any breach of terms or conditions as aforesaid, be under this act entitled to hold the faid property, shall have power, by the name of The Rector and Visitors of Annapolis School, to fue in any court of law or equity, as the case may be, and therein to recover the faid property from the visitors and governors of Saint-John's college, or from any other person or perfors to whom it shall have been illegally conveyed, or to recover the full value of the faid property from the faid vifitors and governors of Saint-John's college, in case they shall have conveyed the faid property, having authority as vilitors and governors to convey the same; and the body corporate for managing the interests of the faid school in Annapolis shall hereafter be known and distinguished, on all occasions on which they shall be mentioned, by no other name than of The Rector and Visitors of Annapolis School, and they shall always from the passage of this act, implead and be impleaded, grant and convey, receive and take, by that and by no other name.
