CHAP. already, under particular laws, received provisions adequate to the faid half pay; and if the faid particular provisions are not adequate to the faid half pay, then such desiciency shall be paid as aforefaid to the widows and children as aforefaid.

To be charged . III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid fums shall be charged to the United States.

Paffed 8th of March, 1786. An ACT to ascertain the value of the land in the several counties of this state for the purpose of laying the public assessment. Lib. TBH. No. A. fol. 684.

Preamble.

HEREAS this general assembly, being fully satisfied of the great inequality that has hitherto taken place in the valuation of lands between the several counties of this state, and impressed with the necessity of preventing the like injustice in suture, have determined to ascertain by law the average value by the acre of the land in the several counties of this state;

Average value of lands, &c.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the average of land by the acre in the several counties be as sollows, to wit: In Kent county at thirty-three shillings and nine-pence, in Prince-George's county at thirty-one shillings and fix-pence, in Baltimore county at twenty-nine shillings and three-pence, in Frederick, Charles, Harford, Anne-Arundel, Queen-Anne's, Talbot and Cacil counties, at twenty-seven shillings in Montgomery, Saint-Mary's, Calvert, Dorchester and Somerset counties, at twenty-sour shillings and nine-pence, in Washington county at twenty-simulatings and six-pence, (a) in Worcester county at twenty shillings and three-pence, and in Caroline county at sisteen shillings and nine-pence, current money.

(a) By November, 1702, ch. 71 sections 12, 13, the average value of the lands by the acre in Allegany county, (which had been created on: of Washington county,) was fixed at 4f, and the average value of the lands in Washington county increased to 24f. That part of the act of 1792 is continued by 1797, ch. 89.

Assessment to 'the imposed, &c.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the annual affestment for supplies be hereafter imposed on the several counties upon the amount of the land in each county, ascertained as aforesaid, at the average value as aforefaid, (b) and the value of the personal property in the several counties, ascertained as shall hereafter be directed by law; and Baltimore-town and its precincts, in Baltimore county, shalk be considered and taken as separate and distinct from the said county, and shall not be taken into the valuation of property in the faid county, and an annual affessment for supplies shall hereafter be imposed upon the faid town distinct and separate from the said county, upon the value of the amount of all the lots and parcels of ground, houses, ground-rent and improvements, lands and real property, in the said town, as ascertained by this act, and the value of personal property in the said town, as certained as hereafter shall be directed by law; and that the limits and bounds of Baltimore-town aforefaid and its precincts, for the purpose aforefaid, hereby are ascertained and established as follow, to wit: Beginning at the end of the east-fouth-east seventy perches line of a tract of land called Parker's Haven, and running thence with a streight line to the end of the third line of Carter's Delight, thence with a streight line to the beginning of Darley Hall, then with the two first lines of Darley Hall the whole length of the faid lines, then with a streight line to the end of the east-north-east two hundred and seventy-eight perches line of Hap Hazard, then with a streight line to the beginning of Hap Hazard, then west-south-west twenty perches, then south unto the land called Georgia, then bounding on the lines of Georgia reverse unto the place where they first cross a small run that passes through a meadow in the land late of Charles Carroll, Esquire, barrifter, and falls into the head of a cove in the land late of Richard Perkins, then running down the faid run into the head of the faid cove, then with the faid cove, and bounding thereon and on the waters of the middle branch, to the Ferry Point on Patapico river, thence with the waters of the faid river, and of the north-well branch of the faid river, to the mouth of Harris's creek, and thence with the waters of the faid creek to the place of beginning; and all land, houses and improvements, within the said limits and bounds, shall be considered and taken, and hereby are declared to be, Baltimore-town and its pre-∢incts.

(b) By November, 1792, ch. 71, sections 14, 15, provisions are made for charging the lands in Allegany county with the public assessment, &c.

Property to be valued separate,

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the property within Baltimore-town and its precincle shall be valued and returned distinct from Baltimore county, and that commissioners of the tax shall be appointed for said town and its precincle separate from said county.
