XI. AND SE IT ENACTED, That the faid truffees, or a major part of them, shall and they are hereby directed and empowered to remove such overseer, and all other officers by them to be appointed in purluance of this acl, at their discretion, and to choose others in their place and overseen a stead.

XII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid trustees, or the major part of them, shall and they And meet four are hereby directed and enjoined to meet at the alms and work-house in the faid county four times a year, in the year, in the first week in January, May, August and November, or oftener, if it should by them be deemed necessary, to make and ordain, by a majority of votes of such as may be present, all fuch good and wholesome ordinances, rules and by-laws, as they shall think convenient and necessary for the direction, government and support, of such alms and work-house, and also for the cleanlinels, maintenance and employment of all fuch poor persons as shall be taken under their care, and of all vagrants; beggars, vagabonds and offenders, that shall be committed thereto by virtue of this act; all which ordinances; rules and by-laws, shall be from time to time inviolably observed by all persons concerned, according to the tenor and effect thereof.

XIII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid overfeer shall keep a fair and regular list of all poor, Overfeer to and of all beggars, vagrants, vagabonds and offenders, who shall be committed to the said alms keep a list, &c. and work-house, and also fair and regular accounts in writing of all materials and other things coming to his hands as overleer aforesaid, and of all expences and charges attending their maintenance and support, and of all monies received by him for the sale of the produce of their labour, and otherwise, as overseer aforesaid, and shall lay the said lists and accounts before the trustees, or the major part of them, at their meetings at the times by this act directed, of oftener, if by them required.

XIV AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid over feer may compel and oblige any of the faid poor, And compet beggars, vagrants and vagabonds, or other offenders, in his alms and work-house, if of a sufficient the poor to ability, to work and labour, and the produce of their labour he is hereby directed and empowered to fell, and apply the money arising from such fale to their maintenance and support.

XV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That upon complaint made, that any person, from his or her difor- Disorderly perderly conduct, gives disturbance to his or their neighbourhood, and is likely to become chargeable to fons may be the faid counties respectively, it shall and may be lawful for any one magistrate of the faid counties, if upon hearing the party he shall judge the complaint to be well founded, to commit such disorderly person, residing within the said counties respectively, to the said work-house, for any time not exceeding three months, unless he or she shall find security, at the discretion of the magistrate aforelaid, in any fum not exceeding twenty pounds current money, for his or her good behaviour during the space of fix months; and also upon complaint and due proof made by the overseer of the laid alms and work-house, to any one trustee, that any person in the said work-house liath behaved and demeaned him or herself in a disorderly manner, or hath resused or neglected to do and perform his or her daily labour and talk, or hath refused or neglected to obey, keep and observe, any of the ordinances, rules and by-laws, of the faid corporation, to order and direct fuch moderate and proper correction, not exceeding twenty-five lashes for any one offence, to be given to such offender, as the nature of the cafe may require.

XVI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That it shall and may be lawful to and for any of the faid trustees to dito direct and appoint under their hand in writing (a) what poor shall be received into such alms and rest what poor work-houle; and it shall and may be lawful for any one justice of the peace for the said county, and ceived, &c. for any perion authorised and appointed by such justice, to apprehend, or cause to be apprehended and committed to the faid work-house, any rogues, vagrants, vagabonds, beggars, and other idle, diffolute and diforderly perfors, found loitering or reliding in the laid county, who follow no labour, trade, occupation or business, and have no visible means of sublistence whereby to acquire an honest livelihood, there to be kept at hard labour for any time not exceeding three months; and the overfeer of fuch alms and work-house shall be obliged to receive any poor appointed as aforesaid to be received, and any rogue, vagrant, vagabond, beggar, and other idle, diffolute and diforderly person, lo as aforelaid committed.

(a) By November, 1788, ch. 36, the truffees of the poor for Dorcheffer and Somerfet are directed to receive such objects and poor persons as the justices thereof shall direct.

XVII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That every person who shall be received into the said alms or work- Poor, &c. to house, and there receive relief, shall, upon the shoulder of the right sleeve of the uppermost garment wear a badge,
