C H A P. LXXIII.

An ACT for building a new prison in the city of Annapolis. Lib. Passed 17th of March, 1786. TBH. No. B. fol. 21.

HEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, that there is no prison in Anne-Arundel Preamble. rity of the faid county;

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That Mefficurs Charles Carroll, of Car- Commissioners rollton, John Hall, Brice Thomas Beale Worthington, James Brice and William Hall, the third, or appointed, &c. the major part of them, shall be commissioners, and are hereby authorised to purchase, for the use of Anne-Arundel county; a piece of ground in the city of Annapolis, whereon to build a new prison; and the faid commissioners are hereby empowered to contract for materials, and to agree with workmen, to build and finish the faid prison, which, when completed, shall, by the said commissioners, be put into the custody and possession of the sheriff of Anne-Arundel county for the time being, and so shall remain and continue in the custody and possession of such sheriff, and his successors, as a public prison for Anne-Arundel county.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the justices of Anne-Arundel county for the time being be and Justices to levy they are hereby authorised and directed, at their August courts in the years seventeen hundred and money, &c. eighty-fix, seventeen hundred and eighty-seven, and seventeen hundred and eighty-eight, to impose on the assessable property of the said county the sum of fifteen hundred pounds current money, to be affelfed in three equal portions, together with an allowance to the collector of four per cent. for collection, which sum so assessed shall be collected by the collector of Anne-Arundel county aforesaid as other county taxes are collected, and when fo collected shall, by the said sheriff, be paid to the commissioners aforesaid, or the major part of them, to be by them applied in purchasing the ground and crecting the faid prison.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the justices of Anne-Arundel county shall pay unto the commission And pay a ceroners aforefaid, or the major part of them, a certificate by them obtained for the damage done the tificate obtainold prilon by the continental foldiers, amounting to the sum of eleven hundred and fifty-three pounds ed, &c. fixteen shillings and five-pence current money, to be by the faid commissioners applied in erecting the faid prison.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the judges of the general court and the chancellor shall have a Judges, &c. right to commit to the faid prison, and any person by them committed shall be received into the faid prison, and any person by them committed shall be received into the faid prison, &c. prison under the care of such officer as shall be by them respectively appointed.

VI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That in case any of the said commissioners shall die, remove, or be incapable to act, the residue, or the major part of them, shall fill up the vacancy.
