To establish a public arfenal,

LXXXVIII.

IX. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the governor and the council be authorifed and requested to establish a public arsenal at Frederick-town, in Frederick county, for the reception of the public arms and accourrements lately imported; and the governor and the council are requested to direct the lieutenants of the several counties, or the officers of the militia, to collect all the arms, and ammunition, and military flores, belonging to the flate in the hands of any of the inhabitants of their county, and any person having such arms, if he resules to deliver the same when required, he shall forseit five pounds current money; and all the arms and ammunition; and military flores, collected on the western shore, shall be conveyed to Frederick-town, and be there deposited and kept with the other public arms herein before mentioned; and all arms and ammunition, and military stores, collected on the eastern shore, shall be conveyed to Talbot-town, and be there deposited and kept in some fit and proper place to be provided for that purpole; and the governor and the council are authorised and requested to appoint an armourer at Frederick-town, and another at Talbot-town, to take charge of. and keep in constant repair and fit for use, all public arms and accourrements to them respectively delivered; and the governor and the council may allow the faid armourers fuch falary as they may think reasonable and proper; and the expence of collecting and conveying the public arms as above directed thall be paid by the public, and the governor and the council are also requested to direct the iron and brass cannon belonging to this state to be put in some proper place to be preserved and kept in order, and fit for fervice.

By November, 1788, ch. 38, the governor and council were empowered to draw on the treasurer in favour of persons having claims for services, or on contracts under this act.

And to receive proposals, &c.

X. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the governor and the council be requested to receive from the agent of this state respecting bank stock any proposals of measures by him to be executed concerning the faid flock, and if they approve his proposals, and think the adoption thereof will be for the advantage of the state, they are hereby authorised and requested to empower and instruct him to carry fuch measures into execution, the said agent being always subject to their advice, instructions and control.

Powers may be exercised, &c.

XI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That all and any of the powers vested by this act in the governor and council may be exercifed by any three or more of them, the governor always being present and having a vote.

C H A P. LXXXIX. An ACT for the payment of the journal of accounts. Lib. TBH. No. B. fol. 77.

Preamble.

THEREAS it appears by the journal of accounts and lift of debts, that there is now due from this state the sum of twelve thousand five hundred and twenty-four pounds seven shillings and feven-pence current money;

Treasurer to juy, &c.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore shall and he is hereby authorised and required to pay the several persons, their executors, administrators, affigns or orders, or to fuch of them as shall offer to receive the same, the several sums of current money allowed to them respectively, as they appear to be settled and ascertained by the journal of accounts aforefaid.

Creditors may receive certiticates, &c.

IIL AND BE IT ENACTED, That all or any of the public creditors on the journal may have their election to receive a certificate or certificates, bearing an interest of fix per cent. per annum, from the treasurer of the western shore, signed by him, and expressing the sum of current money due to such creditor or creditors, which shall be discounted by the collector in payment of the taxes due on the present assessment acts, or on any future assessments; or, if not so discounted, the treasurer of the western for eastern shore shall receive the said certificates, and pay the money due thereon to the bearer, out of the money now in the treasury, or which may hereaster be brought into the treasury by taxes or otherwise.
