Where AS the inhabitants of Frederick town, in Frederick county, by their humble petition Preamble. To this present general assembly, have set forth, that the streets in said town are very subject to be cut in wet weather by loaded waggons, many of which are constantly passing, and that by repeated cuttings, and the waters collecting in some of the principal streets, and particularly in Market-street, the most public street in the said town, and by means of the inhabitants raising the ground before their own houses, and thereby turning the water, with a view to their private convenience only, the said streets are in a very bad condition, and at times have been impassable, and the ground and houses of some of the inhabitants have been much injured by the collected waters in beauty rains and melted snows. which have at times passed through their houses into the town creek: heavy rains and melted snows, which have at times passed through their houses into the town creek; heavy rains and metted mows, which have at times patied through their noutes into the town creek; and also setting forth, that the original plot and certificate of said town are now lost; that there is great reason to believe, that the admeasurement of the lots in said town was inaccurate in the first instance; that from the old stakes, set up as boundaries of said lots, being lost, and from the variation of the compass, many disputes have already arisen, and more might probably arise; and prayed that an act might pass, appointing commissioners for said town, with power to direct the levelling, sloping and amending, the streets in said town, with such drains as they may think proper, and also to regulate and direct the posting of sootways on the sides of the streets, the breadth of the porches, steps to the houses, the paving of those footways, and placing new buildings on the streets; and also empowering the said commissioners to adjust, fix and settle, the lines and boundaries of the several lots and parts of lots, held in said town; which this general assembly have thought proper to grant;

IF. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Jacob Young, Jacob Miller, Mi- Commissioners chael Allix, John MePherion, John Shellman, Conrad Doll and John Hoffman, or a majority of them, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners of Frederick-town; and that on refusal, death, removal or relignation, of any of the faid commissioners, the major part of the remaining commissioners, oners shall appoint another to serve in the stead of such commissioner so resusing, dying, removing or refighing; but before any person appointed or to be appointed a commissioner shall act as such, he shall take an oath or affirmation before some justice of the peace, that he will well and faithfully execute his duty of commissioner of Frederick-town, according to the directions of this act, without partiality or prejudice, to the best of his skill.
