eighteen miles, and then the road towards Frederick-town as far as the line of the county, and then alternately the same distance of the road from Reister's town, and the residue of the road towards York-town.

XXII. And, as a further fund to enable the faid commissioners to make the faid roads, Br 17 enacted, That the sum of two shillings and six-pence current money shall be and hereby is laid and Money to be imposed for every hundred pounds worth of property within Baltimore county, and in the same pro- imposed, &c. portion for every greater or less sum, and the said tax shall be paid and collected with the county tax, and in the lame manner, and the collector shall pay the amount of the faid tax by him collected to fuch person as the commissioners of review shall appoint to receive the same, who shall, from time to time, pay the fame to their order, and the faid tax shall commence in the year seventeen hundred and eighty-eight, and continue until the faid roads shall be made and completed in the manuer directed by this act; and the faid commissioners may, on the credit of the faid tax, borrow, on interest, not exceeding fix per cent. any fum of money they may think proper and necessary to make and complete the faid roads; and the faid commissioners shall, from time to time, at least twice in every year, publish in the Baltimore news-papers an account of the money by them received and expended in virtue of this act.

XXIII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That if any commissioner appointed to survey and make the said. How vacancies roads shall die or refuse to act, the said commissioners of review may fill up such vacancy; and if any are to be filled. commissioner of review shall die or refuse to act, the commissioners of the tax for Baltimore county may fill up such vacancy.

XXIV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners appointed to survey and make the said Commissioners roads shall in all things consult and advise with the said commissioners of review, and all their proceedings shall be subject to their direction and control.

XXV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That any toll to be collected on any of the roads aforefaid finall Tolls shall bebelong to Baltimore county, and finall be collected and applied to the ule of the faid county for ever, long to Baltithe faid county maintaining and repairing the faid roads in the order and condition directed and required by this act.

XXVI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That any waggon, cart or other carriage, loaden or unloaden, Centain carrihaving the felloes of the wheels thereof of nine inches from fide to fide at the leaft, (the fole or bot- ages to pass tolltom, of fuch felloes to be as flat and even from fide to fide as may be,) may pass any turnpike gate free, &c. without paying any toll for the space of three years, to be computed from the time the faid commission oners of review shall declare such road to be completed, and such carriages shall only pay one half the tolls for three years thereafter.

XXVII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That if any person shall drive any riding carriage or waggon, cart, Penalty on peror other carriage of burthen, round any turnpike with intention to evade the payment of the toll, fons and if any person shall ride, lead or drive, his riding horse, liable to toll, round any turnpike with intention to evade the payment of the toll, such person, if a free man, shall forfeit twenty shillings for every such offence, and, if a servant or slave, the master or mistress shall forfeit ten shillings, and fuch fervant or flave shall be whipped by the order of any justice of the peace of the said county, not

XXVIII. And BE IT ENACTED, That each commissioner appointed to lay out and make the roads Allowance to aforefaid shall be entitled to receive ten shillings current money per day for every day he shall at- commissioners. tend in the execution of any of the duties required of him by this act, and each commissioner of review shall be entitled to receive the same sum for every day he shall employ in reviewing any of the roads aforefaid.

XXIX. And BE IT ENACTED, That the faid commissioners of review may allow the person by And persons them employed to receive the monies collected in virtue of this act fuch reasonable salary or compensation as they may think proper and adequate to his trouble, and such person shall give bond with security for the due performance of his trust, and shall keep a fair account on oath, or affirmation, of all monies by him received and paid in virtue of his office of treasurer to the said commissioners; and the faid commissioners may employ a clerk, and make him such allowance for his trouble as they may think reasonable.
