

eighteen miles, and then the road towards Frederick-town as far as the line of the county, and then alternately the same distance of the road from Reister's-town, and the residue of the road towards York-town.

XXII. AND, as a further fund to enable the said commissioners to make the said roads, BE IT ENACTED, That the sum of two shillings and six-pence current money shall be and hereby is laid and imposed for every hundred pounds worth of property within Baltimore county, and in the same proportion for every greater or less sum, and the said tax shall be paid and collected with the county tax, and in the same manner, and the collector shall pay the amount of the said tax by him collected to such person as the commissioners of review shall appoint to receive the same, who shall, from time to time, pay the same to their order, and the said tax shall commence in the year seventeen hundred and eighty-eight, and continue until the said roads shall be made and completed in the manner directed by this act; and the said commissioners may, on the credit of the said tax, borrow, on interest, not exceeding six *per cent.* any sum of money they may think proper and necessary to make and complete the said roads; and the said commissioners shall, from time to time, at least twice in every year, publish in the Baltimore news-papers an account of the money by them received and expended in virtue of this act.

XXIII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That if any commissioner appointed to survey and make the said roads shall die or refuse to act, the said commissioners of review may fill up such vacancy; and if any commissioner of review shall die or refuse to act, the commissioners of the tax for Baltimore county may fill up such vacancy.

XXIV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners appointed to survey and make the said roads shall in all things consult and advise with the said commissioners of review, and all their proceedings shall be subject to their direction and control.

XXV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That any toll to be collected on any of the roads aforesaid shall belong to Baltimore county, and shall be collected and applied to the use of the said county for ever, the said county maintaining and repairing the said roads in the order and condition directed and required by this act.

XXVI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That any waggon, cart or other carriage, laden or unladen, having the felloes of the wheels thereof of nine inches from side to side at the least, (the sole or bottom of such felloes to be as flat and even from side to side as may be,) may pass any turnpike gate without paying any toll for the space of three years, to be computed from the time the said commissioners of review shall declare such road to be completed, and such carriages shall only pay one half the tolls for three years thereafter.

XXVII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That if any person shall drive any riding carriage or waggon, cart, or other carriage of burthen, round any turnpike with intention to evade the payment of the toll, and if any person shall ride, lead or drive, his riding horse, liable to toll, round any turnpike with intention to evade the payment of the toll, such person, if a free man, shall forfeit twenty shillings for every such offence, and, if a servant or slave, the master or mistress shall forfeit ten shillings, and such servant or slave shall be whipped by the order of any justice of the peace of the said county, not exceeding ten lashes.

XXVIII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That each commissioner appointed to lay out and make the roads aforesaid shall be entitled to receive ten shillings current money per day for every day he shall attend in the execution of any of the duties required of him by this act, and each commissioner of review shall be entitled to receive the same sum for every day he shall employ in reviewing any of the roads aforesaid.

Allowance to

XXIX. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said commissioners of review may allow the person by them employed to receive the monies collected in virtue of this act such reasonable salary or compensation as they may think proper and adequate to his trouble, and such person shall give bond with security for the due performance of his trust, and shall keep a fair account on oath, or affirmation, of all monies by him received and paid in virtue of his office of treasurer to the said commissioners; and the said commissioners may employ a clerk, and make him such allowance for his trouble as they may think reasonable.
