and ditches to be cut for draining and leading off the water from the faid roads, and shall also cause CHAP. XXIX. mile-stones to be fet up.

Who may contraff, &c.

II. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid commissioners, or any three of them, are hereby empowered to contract with any person or persons for building a good and substantial bridge over the Great falls of Gunpowder, at the most convenient place, and shall and may cause a gate or turnpike to be erected at the faid bridge, and be entitled to demand and receive the following tolls: For every four wheel riding carriage, including horses and driver, eight-pence; for every two wheel riding carriage, horse and driver, six-pence; for all waggons and other carriages, including horses and driver, eight-pence each; for every horse and rider, two-pence.

And collect money, &c.

III. BE IT ENACTED, That the faid commissioners, or any three of them, may collect money by private subscription or a lottery, or they may pledge the tolls hereafter to be collected in virtue of this act, and raise a sum of money on loan, on the credit thereof, and the same apply towards opening, amending and keeping in repair, the faid road, and building and supporting the bridge aforesaid, as also towards payment and satisfaction of all damages which individuals may sustain by the streightening the faid road, which damages shall be ascertained in the same manner, and under the same limitations, as are provided in and by the act, entitled, An act to lay out several turnpike roads in Baltimore county, passed this present session; * provided nevertheless, that the said tolls so pledged to the person or persons advancing money thereon, shall be void when the said monies so advanced, with eight per cent. interest, shall be repaid them.

By 1791, ch. 31, directions are given for fummoning a jury to inquire into the damages, &c.

To be deemed a public road, &c.

Chapter 23.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid road, when laid out and ftreightened, shall be considered as a public road, and the overfeers of the road shall be obliged to work on the same in such manner as is heretofore provided by law for other public roads.

Commissioners to render account, &c.

V. BE IT ENACTED, That the faid commissioners shall render annually to the county court, to be held for the respective counties, a true, full and fair account, of all monies by them collected and expended by virtue of this act.

VI. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if any of the said commissioners shall die, or refuse to we to be filled act, that the other commissioners may appoint another person or persons in his or their stead. How vacancies

C H A P. XXX.

An additional supplement to the act, * entitled, An act for enlarging the powers of the high court of chancery. Lib. TBH. No. B.

Preamble.

VHEREAS doubts have been conceived, that under the powers heretofore vested in the high court of chancery the chancellor cannot grant relief in certain cases, or pronounce any decree against persons not residing in this state, and many cases may arise where justice requires that order fliould be taken therein;

In certain fuits an order, &c.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That if in any fuit which shall be hereafter continuy make commenced in chancery against any defendant or defendants who resides out of this state, to compel the conveyance of land, or real or personal property, being in this state, or for compliance with any contract respecting land, or real or personal property, in this state, on affidavit being made to the fatisfaction of the court, that fuch defendant or defendants is or are out of the state, and that perfonal notice has been served on the defendant or defendant or that notice of filing such bill hath been given ten weeks in the public news-papers of the state or kingdom where the defendant or defendants may relide; then and in fuch case the faid court may make an order, directing and appointing such defendant or desendants to appear at a certain day therein to be named, and a copy of such order shall forthwith be inferted in the Maryland Gazette, and continued therein four weeks, and if fuch defendant or defendants shall not appear within the time limitted by such order, then on proof being made of fuch publication of fuch order, the court, being fatisfied of the truth thereof, may order the bill of the plaintiff to be taken pro confesso, and make such decree thereupon as shall be thought just, and may thereupon issue such process thereon as may be necessary and are usual in other cases where decrees have been made, the plaintiff or plaintiffs giving such security as the said court fliall direct, touching the reftitution of fuch land, or real or personal property, (as the case may be,) fha die int COU not he or
