That all the lots, fireets, lanes and alleys, that have been laid off, fold and conveyed, given or granted, by the commissioners of conficated British property, and others, which are situate within the forks of Elk river, and heretofore called the Head of Elk, and all the lots, fireets, lanes and be reputed a alleys, which hereafter may be laid out by the commissioners hereafter appointed, and their successors, town, &c. shall be reputed, held and esteemed, a town; and that the state of Maryland, Jacob Hollingsworth and Henry Hollingsworth, and others, to whom the right of soil in the said streets, lanes and alleys, and lots aforefaid, did belong and appertain, shall for ever hereafter be barred from having or holding the fame, unless the inhabitants of the faid town shall cease and decline to use them for the purpose for which they were granted; provided nevertheless, that the commissioners, or their successors, shall not make any street, lane or alley, or lay off any lots, save where they have been heretofore made and laid off by the direction of the commissioners of confiscated British property, and others who have laid off and conveyed lots, or which shall be done with the free consent and approbation of the owners of the lands which shall or may hereafter be laid off into lots, streets, lanes and al-

IX. AND BE IT ENACTED, That Joseph Gilpin, Jonathan Booth, Zebulon Hollingsworth, Henry Commissioners Hollingsworth and Tobias Rudulph, junior, be and are hereby appointed commissioners to survey and appointed, &c. lay out all lands, or parcels of lands, heretofore surveyed and laid out into lots, lanes and alleys, by the commissioners of confiscated British property, and others, agreeably to the surveys heretofore made, and the same, when surveyed, to lay out into lots, streets, lanes and alleys, and a correct and accurate plot thereof returned to the clerk of Caril county, by him to be recorded among the land records of the faid county, and kept in the faid office, and the fame, or a copy thereof, shall always be evidence as to the streets, lanes and alleys, and the bounds and lines of lots in the faid town.

X. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid commissioners, or a major part of them, shall cause all Lots to be the lots in the faid town to be substantially and fairly bounded and numbered, and marked with the bounded, &co name of the present occupant or owner, if known; and it shall be the duty of the commissioners, and their successors, from time to time hereafter, to see that the said boundaries be kept up and preferved, and to hinder encroachments to be made on any of the fireets, lanes, alleys or public grounds aforefaid.

XI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That when the commissioners aforesaid shall have completed their sur- When surveyvey as aforesaid, which they are hereby required to do within two years, and shall have caused the called Elkton, same to be recorded among the land records of Cæcil county, the town aforesaid, heretosore called &c. the Head of Elk, shall be for ever hereafter called and known by the name of Elkton.

XII. And, that a succession of commissioners, who may be zealous to promote the convenience and interest of the inhabitants, may be provided for, BE IT ENACTED, That on the Easter Monday Seven commisyearly, or as foon thereafter as may be convenient, and every year after the survey aforesaid shall sioners to be be completed and recorded, the inhabitants of the town aforesaid, qualified by the constitution and ly, &c. form of government, shall assemble and make choice of seven men, being either inhabitants of the town aforefaid, or having a real estate therein worth three hundred pounds current money at the least, which seven men, so chosen, shall be the commissioners of the said town, and the trustees of the school in said town, called the Town School, for and during the year next after their election as

By 1793, ch. 42, all alls done by the faid commissioners and trustees who continued to all without being elected annually, are made valid; and by 1796, ch. 31, the power of appointing such commissioners, &c. shall not cease by neglect of the inhabitants to make an election in the manner and time required.

XIII. And BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners of the town, or a major part of them, shall Who may emhave full power and authority to employ a clerk, and at their pleasure to displace him and choose ploy a clerk, another, who shall, before he acts as such, take the following oath, or affirmation if a quaker, menonist or tunker: " I, A. B. do swear, or affirm, that as clerk of the commissioners of Elkton I will "behave and demean myself diligently, faithfully and honestly, in the several duties of my said of-"fice, according to the best of my skill and knowledge; so help me God;" and that it shall be the duty of the said clerk of the said commissioners, fairly and honestly to enter in a book to be kept for that purpole, all the proceedings of the faid commissioners relating to the said town, in which book, among other things, shall be kept a fair plot of faid town, describing every lot by its number, and who the present occupant and owner is, and shall also duly attend the markets in faid town, and use his best endeavours that the regulations of the said market above mentioned shall be observed, and that no falle weights and measures be used, or unwholesome provisions be fold, or offered to sale, in faid market, and shall have power to try any weights and measures used in said market, and when
