AND BE IT ENACTED, That the operation of this act shall commence on the first day of Ja- C H A P. nuary next, and shall be read aloud by the clerk of each county court at the March and April courts, Commenceduring the continuance of this act.

V. This act to continue in force during the term of seven years, and to the end of the next session. of assembly which shall happen thereafter.

Continued by 1794, ch. 71, to 30th January, 1798; when it expired. Revived and continued, (except where altered,) by 1798, ch. 10, to the end of the session, and all acts done under it confirmed; and by 1798, ch. 71, continued to 30th October, 1805, &c.

C H A P. XXXIV.

An ACT respecting insolvent debtors. Lib. TBH. No. B. fol. 257.

Passed 25th of May, 1787.

This act was to continue one year, &c. Repealed by May, 1788, ch. to, provided, that all applications to the chancellor or county courts for the benefit thereof, on or before the twenty-fourth of May, 1788, and all proceedings thereon made, or thereafter to be made, should be carried on and perfected in the same manner as if the said act were in full force and virtue.

C H A P. XXXV.

An ACT to aid the proceedings of the commissioners of Georgetown, in Kent county. Lib. TBH. No. B. fol. 266.

HEREAS the inhabitants of George town, in Kent county, by their petition to this general Preamble. affembly, have fet forth, that in the year seventeen hundred thirty-fix a law passed appointing and empowering certain commissioners to lay out a town on a certain tract of land called Tolchester. on the fouth fide of Sassafras river, and to employ a sufficient clerk to make true entries, upon oath, of their proceedings, and directing the faid entries to be made up in a well bound book, and lodged with the county clerk for the inspection of any person: And whereas the said book, containing the entries of the town aforefaid, is lost or mislaid, whereby the said petitioners may sustain considerable loss and be liable to disputes;

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That William Rogers, John Vorhees, Commissioners James Henry, Joseph Sturgis and Samuel Earle, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to appointed, &c. refurvey and lay out the faid town agreeably to the original location thereof.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid commissioners shall cause a certificate and plot of the Certificate, &c. faid town to be registered, by a clerk to be appointed by them for such purpose, in a well bound book, to be recorded, and return a certificate and plot of the said town to the clerk of the county, which said certificate and plot shall be conclusive evidence of the metes and bounds of said town.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid commissioners shall appoint a surveyor and chain-carriers A surveyor to for the purpose of laying out said town, and levy and affess on the several lots and buildings within be appointed, the limits of faid town as much money, in the discretion of the same commissioners, as may be ne- &c. cessary to carry this act into execution.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That in case any one or more commissioners aforesaid should die, re- How vacancies fuse to act, or remove from the said town, the remaining or surviving commissioners shall elect and are to be silled. appoint other or others in the room and stead of such commissioner or commissioners so dying, resuling to act, or removing as aforefaid.

C H A P. XXXVI.

An ACT for the appointment of, and conferring powers in, deputies Paffed 26th of May, 1787. from this state to the federal convention. Lib. TBH. No. B. fol. 268.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the honourable James M'Henry, Dani- Deputies apel of Saint Thomas Jenifer, Daniel Carroll, John Francis Mercer and Luther Martin, Esquires, pointed, &c. be appointed and authorifed, on behalf of this flate, to meet fuch deputies as may be appointed and authorifed by any other of the United States to affemble in convention at Philadelphia, for the purpote of revifing the federal fystem, and to join with them in considering such alterations, and further provisions, as may be necessary to render the sederal constitution adequate to the exigencies of the union, and in reporting such an act for that purpose to the United States in congress assembled, as, when agreed to by them, and duly confirmed by the several states, will essectually provide for the fame; and the faid deputies, or fuch of them as shall attend the faid convention, shall have full power to represent this state for the purposes aforesaid; and the said deputies are hereby directed to
