for any person authorised and appointed by such justice, to apprehend, or cause to be apprehended and committed to the faid work-house, any vagrants, vagabonds, beggars, and other idle, dissolute and disorderly persons, found loitering or residing in the said county, who follow no labour, trade, occupation or business, and have no visible means of sublishence whereby to acquire an honest livelihood, there to be kept at hard labour for any time not exceeding three months; and the overfeer of fuch alms and work-house's hereby required to receive into the faid alms and work-house, any poor appointed as aforefaid to be received, and any vagrant, vagabond, beggar, and other idle, dissolute and disorderly person, so as aforesaid committed.

XVII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That who loever shall presume, either to set up a booth, stall, or Penalty on other convenience, for the felling of strong liquors, on the land purchased for the use of the said keeping booth, alms and work-house, or shall commit any kind of trespass thereon, or shall sell or dispose of any firong liquor, or other matter or thing whatfoever to, or purchase any matter or thing whatfoever from, any poor, or other person entertained in the said alms and work-house, shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay the fum of ten pounds current money.

XVIII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That all sheriffs, constables, and all other officers and ministers of Sheriffs, &c. justice, shall be aiding and assisting to the said trustees for the poor in the said county, and to all such to aid trustees, officers as shall be employed by them, as by this act is directed, in the execution and performance of officers as shall be employed by them, as by this act is directed, in the execution and performance of the faid fervice."

XIX. AND BE IT ENACTED, That if any person or persons shall, at any time or times, be sued or General issue profecuted for any matter or thing by him or them done and executed in pursuance and execution of pleadable, &c. this act, or of any matter or thing in this act contained, such person or persons shall and may plead the general issue, and give this act and the special matter in evidence, for his or their defence; and if upon trial a verdict shall pass for the defendant or defendants, or if the plaintiff or plaintiffs shall become nonsuit, or discontinue his or their suit, then such defendant or defendants shall have and recover treble cofts to him or them awarded against such plaintiff or plaintiffs, and if the plaintiff or plaintiffs is or are unable to fatisfy the same, then it shall be paid and satisfied by the attorney who brought fuch suit; unless the plaintiff or plaintiffs shall give security for the costs, to be approved by the court in which such suit is brought.

XX. And, to prevent individuals from being unreasonably burthened with the execution of this act as trustees for the poor, Be IT ENACTED, That at the time of the meeting of the said trustees for Three trustees the poor in the first week of November yearly, the said trustees, or the major part of them, in annually, &c. the county aforefaid, shall and may elect and choose three of the inhabitants of the said county, to be trullees for the poor of that county in the stead of the first three named or eldest of the said trustees of the same county, which said first named or eldest trustee shall be and is by virtue hereof thencefrom discharged from their office.

XXI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That it shall and may be lawful for the trustees aforesaid, or a Trustees torent major part of them, to rent an house or houses in the said county for the reception of such poor, an house, &c. vagrants, vagabonds or other offenders, with the necessary lot or lots of ground adjoining to such house or houses, as convenient to the court-house as may be in the same county, for the reception and accommodation of the faid poor, wagrants, vagabonds and other offenders, until a fufficient fum of money he railed in virtue of this act to enable the faid trustees to purchase the land and erect the buildings herein before mentioned; and the justices of the said county are hereby empowered and enjoined, annually, at the court for laying the county rate, to affels on the taxable property of the faid county a fufficient fum to discharge the rent aforesaid, with the collector's commission of six per cent. thereon; which fum, so as aforesaid assessed, shall be collected and paid by the said collector to the faid truftees, or a majority of them, to be by them applied to the purpoles aforefaid; and the faid truffces, or the major part of them, are hereby empowered and required, as foon as fuch house or houses aforesaid are procured on rent, to proceed to the appointment of an overseer, and other officers and fervants, as are mentioned in this act, and to do and perform every other matter and thing necessary to the carrying the said act into execution, according to the true intent and meaning thereof.

By 1799, ch. 65, the truftees in this and other counties are empowered to keep any number of our penfioners not exceeding ten, and to allow to each an annual pension not exceeding thirty dollars.
