CHAP.

An ACT for the relief of the securities of John Hayman Nichols, collector of the tax for Montgomery county. Lib. TBH. No. B. fol. 314.

Preamble.

THEREAS Henry Brookes, by his petition to this general assembly, hath set forth, that he, together with James Sutor, Leonard Davis, William Fee and Zadock Dickerson, became fecurity for John Hayman Nichols, as collector for Montgomery county for the year feventeen hundred and eighty-four, on whose collection there is a balance due to the public of about one thousand nine hundred pounds, for which a fieri facias issued against the property of the said Nichols and his faid securities; that on the said fieri facias the property of the said Nichols, and of all his securities aforesaid, except Leonard Davis, was taken, to the value of near five thousand pounds, but that none of the faid property has been fold, although process has issued for that purpose, except five hundred acres of land of James Sutor; that Robert Peter, John Murdock, William Deakins, junior, Bernard Oneale, Edward Burgels, Walter Smith and Richard Thompson, became counter lecurities to the petitioner, and the other original fecurities, and are ultimately answerable to them, but that it will be to the ruin of the said original securities, who are unable to advance the money, to have their property fold at this time, although they may afterwards recur to the counter fecurities; that the faid John Hayman Nichols hath furrendered his books and papers to the faid counter fecurities, on which, though there can be no reliance on their accuracy, there appears to be a balance due from the people of about two thousand eight hundred pounds; and prayed that an act may puls, transferring the collection of the faid arrears to the faid counter fecurities, giving them an indulgence till the year seventeen hundred and ninety, upon their entering into bond to the state, with undoubted fecurity, for the payment of the faid balance at that time, and empowering them to indemnify themfelves, as far as possible, by means of the estate of the said Nichols; and that upon such bond being given, the petitioner, and the other fecurities of the faid Nichols, be released and discharged: And whereas this legislature are disposed, as far as may be consistent with the public interest, to grant relief to those who are, by an act of benevolence, made answerable for the failure and milmanagement

Securities may appoint a col-lector, &c.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That Robert Peter, John Murdock, William Deakins, junior, Bernard Oneale, Edward Burgeis, Walter Smith and Richard Thompson, of Montgomery county, or a majority of them, be and they are hereby empowered to appoint a collector of the relidue of the public assessment now remaining due and unsatisfied in the said county for the year feventeen hundred and eighty-four, in the room of the faid John Hayman Nichols; and fuch collector is hereby fully authorifed and empowered to receive and collect, by execution or otherwise, all arrearages and balances of the faid public affessment due the faid John Hayman Nichols as collector of the county aforesaid for the year aforesaid, in as full and ample manner as the said John Hayman Nichols might or could have received or collected the same during the time of his being collector in the faid county, and no payment made to the faid John Hayman Nichols of any fuin due for the public assessment, after notice of this act, shall be of any avail.

And call on all deputies, &c.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid Robert Peter, John Murdock, William Deakins, junior, Bernard Oneale, Edward Burgess, Walter Smith and Richard Thompson, or a majority of them, are hereby invested with full power and authority to call on all deputies, agents, receivers, collectors, or perfons so appointed by the said John Hayman Nichols, and acting as such, for a final settlement of his or their books and accounts with the faid John Hayman Nichols, fo far as respects the faid public assessment, which said deputies, agents, receivers, collectors, or persons acting as such, or who were in any manner concerned in the receipt or collection of the faid public affeliment during the year aforesaid, or afterwards, under the said John Hayman Nichols, or in his name, or by virtue of his authority, shall, when he or they are thereunto required by the said Robert Peter, John Murdock, William Deakins, junior, Bernard Oneale, Edward Burgels, Walter Smith and Richard Thompson, or a majority of them, respectively produce, shew, explain to, and lay before them, all books, accounts, papers, memorandums and vouchers, whatfoever, of the faid deputy, agent, receiver,
