themselves for the office of trustees for the poor of their county, which they are to do by taking and fublications, the feveral ouths (or affirmations), appointed by law to be taken to the government, and lubfcribing a declaration of their belief in the christian religion; and also taking the following oath wiz "I, A. B. do fwear, or affirm, that I will duly and faithfully discharge the duties and trusts committed to me as a trustee for the poor of Montgomery or Harford county, as the case may be, by an act of the general assembly, entitled. An act for the relief of the poor of Montgomery and Harford counties, according to the best of my skill and knowledge; so help me God;" the which oaths are to be administered by any of the persons last named for the county to the person first named; or in his absence to any one of the persons first named that shall be there present, the which person being sworn as aforesaid, shall administer the oaths afore-mentioned to all the rest, and to fuccessively, the person first named that shall be present shall always administer the faid oaths to any that have been absent, or that shall hereafter be elected and chosen pursuant to the directions of this act to fupply the place of any that shall be dead, or removed out of the county, or if any shall refuse or neglect to qualify, or be rendered incapable of acting as a trustee, when elected and chosen pursuant to the direction of this act; and the aforefaid persons, or the majority of them, being iworn as aforesaid, shalls be constituted and qualified as trustees of the poor of their said county, and as fuch are hereby invested with full power and authority, as a body politic, to plead and be impleaded, to fue and be fued, to defend and be defended, to answer and be answered, by the name of The Trustees of the Poor of Montgomery or Harford County, as the case may be, in all and every cause, complaint and action, real, personal or mixed, of whatever kind or nature it may be, in any court of judicature within this flate, and by that name they and any of them, and their fuccessors, shall and they are hereby enabled to take, hold, possess and enjoy, any gift, donation or present, which shall or may hereafter be given, devised or bequeathed, by any person or persons whatfoever, to them, or any of them, for or towards the support and maintenance of the poor in their respective counties; and they, or any of them, may receive by way of subscription, any sum or fums of money which shall or may be given for the better and more speedy promoting the benefit and good by this act intended; and that they have full power, authority and ability, to purchase, take, hold, receive, enjoy and have, to them and their fuccessors for ever, any lands, tenements and hereditaments, not exceeding the yearly value of five hundred pounds current money, and are hereby respectively empowered and authorised to use one common seal in their business relating to the faid corporation, and the same, if necessary, to change and alter; and that the said persons so incorporated, and their fuccessors, shall be the true and undoubted trustees, in perpetual fuccession, for ever, to be continued in way and manner hereafter specified, with full and absolute power, liberty and authority, in the making and ordaining fuch laws, orders and rules, for the better relieving, regulating and fetting the poor to work, and punishing vagrants, beggars, vagabonds and offenders, and for the good government of the faid alms and work-house in their said county respectively, as to them and their fuccessors shall, from time to time, think most sit and requisite, all which shall be observed by the overseers of such alms and work-houses, and by all poor, beggars, vagrants, vagabonds and offenders, in such alms and work-houses, under the penalties therein contained; provided always, that the faid rules, laws and orders, be no ways contrary to the laws of this state. ..

IV. AND, to perpetuate the fuccession of the aforesaid number of seven trustees for the said counties, BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That as often as any one of the faid How vacancies trustees for the poor in the faid counties shall die, or remove himself out of the county, resuse to be silled. qualify, by taking and subscribing the oaths or affirmations, and subscribing the declaration aforefaid, or become incapable of acting, the trustees for the time being for the county wherein such vacancy shall happen, then surviving and remaining within the said county, or the major part of them, are hereby authorifed and required to elect, nominate and choose, one of the principal inhabitants of the county in the place and room of fuch truffee, and to fill up the number of truftees for fuch alms and work-houses, the which persons so elected and chosen, from time to time, are always to be qualified in the same manner as before by this act is directed.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That every person by this act appointed as a trustee for the poor, or Penalty on rethat shall hereafter be nominated and appointed as such pursuant to the directions thereof, and who fulal to serve, shall wilfully refuse or delay to take upon him the said office, shall forfeit and pay, for every such refusal or delay, the sum of ten pounds current money; provided, that no member of the general assembly, clergyman, attorney, or practifing physician, be obliged to accept the office of trustee aforefaid, or forfeit as aforefaid for refuling to accept and take upon him the same, and that no judge of the general court, county magistrate or sheriff, or any one who hath not the qualification to be a member of the general assembly, if elected, shall be capable to be chosen or act as a trustee aforesaid.
