V. AND BE, IT ENACTED, That the trulees of the faid alms and work-house, and their successors, may take upon them, the trust intended to be committed to them, by taking only the oath of office And take upon prescribed in the act above mentioned, any thing therein to the contrast notwithstanding, and when them the trust, so qualified, they, or a major part of them, shall, at the time of their meeting in the first week in &c. November annually, belides the powers heretofore given them, appoint by ballot a treasurer to receive all the monies belonging to the funds of faid institution, which treaturer shall give bond with fufficient fecurity to the truffees for the time being, and their successors; that he will fairly and honestly account with faid trustees for all property belonging to faid funds which may come into his possession, at the expiration of every year, or sooner if required by said trustees, or their successors, provided that fuch treasurer shall be one of the trustees for the time being, and a compensation shall be made him for his trouble out of the funds aforefaid, not exceeding three per cent. on the monies he receives and accounts for.

An additional supplementary act to the act, \* entitled, An act for building a new church in the city of Annapolis. Lib. TBH. No. B. fol. 421.

WHEREAS the truttees appointed to build the faid church were directed by the aforefaid original Preamble. act to build an elegant church, adorned with a steeple, the expence whereof was estimated at fix thouland pounds current money, one half, thereof to be railed by subscription, and the other half to be paid by the public and the parishioners equally: And whereas it appears to this general assembly, that the faid truftees, in obedience to the aforefaid act, in the year feventeen hundred and feventy-fix, purchased materials to a large amount, most of which, during the war, were taken and carried away, partly by individuals, and partly by the order of the council of fafety, for the confiruction of batteries, barracks, and other public uses; that during the war, the faid trustees were obliged to delift from the further profecution of the work; that by a supplementary act passed in the year seventuen hundred and eighty-sive, † the faid trustees were directed to proceed on the execu- † Chapter 44. tion of the trult reposed in them, and to call on all persons who had any of the materials, and oblige them to account and pay for the fame, and to open new subscriptions; that in compliance with the directions, of the laid act, the laid truffees have procured a liberal subscription, to the amount of three thousand four hundred and fifty-four pounds, and, confiding in the justice and liberality of the public to make good the amount of the materials taken for public uses, and the deficiencies inevitably occasioned during the war, have proceeded to execute the original plan, from which they did not think themselves at liberty to deviate, and have carried on the work so far as to secure the shell of the building: And whereas it appears, by the most accurate estimate that can now be obtained, that the materials taken for public ules as aforefuid amount to the sum of seven hundred and forty-two pounds fifteen shillings;

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore Treasurer to pay to the faid truftees, out of the first monies that shall come into the treasury unappropriated by pay trustees, law the sum of seven hundred and forty-two pounds listeen shillings, with legal interest thereon ac. law, the fum of feven hundred and forty-two pounds fifteen shillings, with legal interest thereon from the twenty-feventh day of May, seventeen hundred and eighty-eight.

III. And, whereas it appears to this general affembly right and proper that the faid truftees be empowered, in a summary way, to recover from all persons who have taken away any of the materials aforelaid the value of the materials fo taken, with damages for the detention of the same, and also to recover from any of the subscribers on the new subscription the balance of their subscriptions which remain due and unpaid, BE IT ENACTED, That the faid trustees may file a bill in equity against any person or persons, their agents or attornies, in the county court where they respectively relide, and the justices of the faid courts respectively shall and they are hereby authorised and required to proceed in a summary way, at the first court, to compel a discovery of the materials taken, and payment of the sum adjudged to be due, with all legal costs, and execution shall thereupon issue,
