C H A P. XXXVII.

An ACT to enable James Gittings, John Gorsuch and John Merryman, the purchasers of confiscated lands, to obtain patents for the same, and for other purposes therein mentioned. Lib. JG. No. 1.

HEREAS James Gittings and John Gorsuch, of Baltimore county, and John Merryman, of Preamble.

Baltimore town, have, by their petition to this present general assembly, set forth, that the faid petitioners, in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty-five, severally purchased of the intendant of the revenue leveral parcels of leafed and vacant lands, lying in the late proprietary referve and manor lands in Baltimore county, adjacent to their respective lands, which lands, so purchased by them, they have paid for, but as the same lay in narrow slips round their other property, and could not be furveyed, (but with very great expence,) except by a refurvey, including patent and leased lands, the faid petitioner, James Gittings, had his tract of land, lying in the faid county, called Gittings's Choice, resurveyed by one of the special surveyors, including part of a lease and the vacancy purchased, amounting in the whole to nine hundred and one acres, by the name of Gittings's Choice Resurveyed, as by the certificate appears; and the faid John Merryman also having had his tract of land, lying in the faid county, called Hereford, refurveyed by the county furveyor, including a leafe and vacancies purchased, amounting in the whole to one thousand and thirty-eight acres and three quarters of an acre, by the name of Hereford Resurveyed, as by the certificate appears; and that the faid James Gittings and John Merryman could not obtain patents for their faid lands, because the county surveyor could not legally include in his survey any lease or vacant lands fold by the intendant, neither could the special surveyors resurvey patent lands; and the said John Gorfuch finding the difficulties aforefaid, had declined making any furvey, until fome effectual mode for making the faid surveys should be pointed out, and praying relief in the premises; and it appearing to this general assembly, that the said petitioners ought to be relieved, agreeable to the prayer of their faid petition;

II.
