Remainder to be feld, &c.

X. And BE IT ENACTED, That the remainder of the faid lots be fold for any kind of specie certificates of this state, to be paid at the time of the fale.

XI. AND, whereas it appears to this general affembly, that ten affiftant furveyors have been employed by the faid Francis Deakins in the execution of the faid furvey feven hundred and feventyfive days, to wit: Henry Kemp, one hundred and twenty days, Daniel Crefap, fifty-eight days, Laurence Bringle, ninety-eight days, Benjamin Price, eighty-eight days, John Tomlinson, fifty-eight days, Jonas Hogmire, eighty-four days, Thomas Orm, leventy days, John Hooker, ninety-two days, John Lynn, fifteen days, William Hoye, ninety-two days, BE IT ENACTED, That there be allowed to each of the faid affiltants the fum of ten shillings current money per day.

XII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That as to the lands patented or taken up within the manors and the not give orders, referves aforefaid, the general affembly cannot with propriety give orders for any disposition thereof, but that the cases of each ought to be stated by the governor and council, and the attorney-general's opinion taken, so that the claim of the Rate may be profesured or relinquished; as law and justice may require.

Lands may be taken up, &c.

XIII. AND BE IT ENACTED That any of the faid lands, not herein before appropriated, and any other lands in this state now vacant, and to affect which no warrant hath issued, be liable to be taken up in the usual manner by warrant, at the rate of three shillings and nine-pence current money per acre, to be paid to the treasurer of the western slove in the proportions and within the times required by the act (a) to appropriate certain lands to the use of the officers and soldiers of this state, and for the fale of vacant lands.

Privilege referved.

XIV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the privilege of roads and waters through all the faid lands be reserved to the public.

Line within the boundary, &c.

XV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the line to which the faid Francis Deakins has laid out the faid lots, is, in the opinion of the general affembly, far within that which this flate may rightfully claim as its western boundary; and that at a time of more leifure the consideration of the legislature ought to be drawn to the western boundaries of this sate, as objects of very great importance.

Plot, &c. to be lodged, &c.

XVI. And BE IT ENACTED, That the faid general plot and books of certificates be lodged in the land-office, and that the faid books of certificates of the four thousand one hundred and fixty-five lots aforefaid, be confidered, to all intents and purposes, as record books of the land-office.

Expences to be alcertained, &c.

XVII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the necessary expences attending the faid survey shall be as certained by the committee of claims at the next fession of assembly, and that the orders given by the faid Francis Deakins in favour of persons who furnished provisions and performed services in the execution of the faid furvey, shall be receivable in payment of the lands to be valued to the fettlers aforesaid, the amount of the said orders to be debited to the said Francis Deakins, in addition to the fix hundred pounds received from the treasurer; and by him to be accounted for.

Allowance to F. Deakins.

XVIII. And he it enacted, That there be allowed to the faid Francis Deakins, for his trouble in completing the faid work, making out the plots and registering the certificates aforesaid, the sum of two hundred pounds current money.

Notice to be given, &c.

XIX. And BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioner or commissioners to be appointed as aforesaid. as foon as may be, give fix weeks notice in the Maryland Gazette and Baltimore Journal of the time and place when and where a distribution of the aforesaid lands, in pursuance of the directions of this act, among the officers and foldiers entitled as aforefaid, shall take place; and the auditor-general shall furnish the said commissioner or commissioners with a list of the officers and soldiers entitled as aforefaid, and no draught shall be made for any officer or foldier, unless the name of the officer or foldier shall appear in the list to be furnished by the auditor-general as aforesaid.

XX. AND BE IT ENACTED, That after the faid draught shall have taken place, the name of the officer and foldier shall be endorsed on the ticket containing the number or numbers, which shall be
