ralinto have a road laid out from the Great falls of Gunpowder, at a place known by the name of Meredith's Ford, until it intersect the main road leading from Baltimore town to York-town, in Pennifylvania, at a place called Burck's Old Field;

HI. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That Abraham Rutledge, George Fitz-Commissioners hugh, Edmund Stansbury, Richard Britton and Luke Johnson, be and they are hereby appointed appointed, &c. commissioners for the purposes in this act mentioned; and the said commissioners, or any three or more of them, are hereby authorised to lay off and open as aforesaid, at the expence of the subfcribers of the faid petition, a waggon-road, in the most convenient direction, not exceeding forty feet wide, from or near Meredith's Ford, on the Great falls of Gunpowder, in Baltimore county, to interfect the main road leading from Baltimore-town to York-town, in Pennsylvania, at a place called Burck's Old Field; and the faid road, when so laid out and competed at the expence of the faid subscribers, and after the valuations herein after directed to be made, or the damages hereby directed to be affested, shall be paid or secured to the individuals concerned, shall be recorded among the records of Baltimore county court, and be thereafter deemed and taken to be a public road for ever, and shall be kept in repair in the same manner as other public roads are directed to be kept in faid county.

III. And BE IT ENACTED, That the faid commissioners may appoint one of their number as trea- Who may apfurer, who is hereby enjoined and empowered to collect and receive all monies subscribed, or that point a treasumay be subscribed, for the purpose of laying out and clearing the said road, and such subscribers are hereby directed to pay their several subscriptions to the treasurer appointed as aforesaid; and if any person shall neglect or refuse to pay his subscription money, the said treasurer, or any of the said commissioners in the name of the whole, may and is hereby authorised to sue for, recover and receive the same; and the said monies, when received, shall be applied by the said commissioners, or any two of them, to the purposes of this act.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners aforesaid shall ascertain and value what damages And ascertain may be fultained by any person or persons through whose land the faid road may pass, by opening damages, &c. and clearing the fame, and the faid valuation shall be made before the faid commissioners shall proceed to open and clear the same; and in case any proprietor or proprietors, or their guardian or trustee, shall conceive themselves aggreeved by the valuation of the said commissioners, it shall and may be lawful for any justice of the peace for Baltimore county, on application by any person interested, to issue his warrant under hand and seal, directed to any constable of the county, commanding him to fummon five freeholders, difinterested as to the faid road, to appear on a day by him to be appointed on the land of the person making application as aforelaid, and the faid freeholders Thall respectively repair to some magistrate of the said county, and take the following oath or affirmation, to wit: "I, A. B. do swear, or folemnly, fincerely and truly declare and affirm, that I will "honestly and faithfully estimate and value the damage and injury sustained by C. D. by opening a road through the land of the faid C. D. in pursuance of the directions of this act;" and shall return the damages by them assessed to the said justice of the peace, and the damages so assessed and returned shall be conclusive; and the party or parties in whole favour the valuation ascertained by the faid commissioners, or the damages assessed by the faid freeholders, shall be made, shall be entitled to receive the same from the said commissioners, and the said commissioners shall pay, or secure to be paid, the amount, of the faid valuation or damages to the respective parties entitled to receive the fame, out of the monies to be raifed and collected from the subscriptions to the said road, within the space of fix months after the ascertainment of such valuation or damages, and before they shall proceed to affect the lands and tenements of the person or persons concerned; provided, that the said road shall not go through any houses, gardens, meadows or orchards, unless with the consent of the owner thereof.
