An ACT to authorife and empower the justices of Prince-George's Dec. 1789 to affels and levy on the inhabitants of faid county the fum of one hundred and fifty pounds current money for the purposes therein mentioned. Lib. [G. No. 1. fol. 156.

D. E. T. ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the justices of Prince-George's county, Justices to leve money, &c. levy laying court, to affels and levy on the owners of property in faid county a fum not exceeding one hundred and fifty pounds current money, for the purpose of erecling a fale, substantial, and durable bridge over the eastern branch of Patowmack river, near the town of Bladensburgh, where the fame is crolled by the great post-road leading from the said town to George-town; and that the said sum, together with the usual commission, be collected in the same manner in which other county charges are collected.

II: AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid justices are hereby authorised and empowered to contract And contract with a proper person or persons to build the said bridge in a good, substantial and workman-like manner; which faid person or persons, to employed, shall give bond with sufficient security, to be approved of by the faid justices, in the penalty of five hundred and fifty pounds, to build and complete the same as aforesaid.

CHAP: XXIX.

An ACT for the division of Washington county, and for erecting a new one by the name of Allegany. Lib. JG. No. 1. fol. 157.

TATHEREAS a pumber of the inhabitants of Wallington county, by their petition to the gene- Presmble. ral affembly, have prayed that an act may pass for a division of said county by Sideling Hill creek, and for erecting a new one out of the western part thereof; and it appearing to this general affembly that the creeting fuch new county will conduce greatly to the due administration of justice, the speedy settling and improving the western part thereof, and the case and convenience of the inhabitants thereof,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all that part of Washington county A new county which lies to the westward of Sideling Hill creek, shall be and is hereby erected into a new county, erected, &c. by the name of Allegany county, and the inhabitants thereof shall have, hold and enjoy, all such rights and privileges as are held and enjoyed by the inhabitants of any other county in this state.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the county court and orphans court for Allegany county shall be Where courts held at the town of Cumberland, until the voters of faid county, by election to be held as herein are to be held, after provided, shall determine on some other place; and until a place shall be fixed on by the said election, and a court-house shall be built, the justices of said county may contract and agree, at the county charge, for a convenient place in the faid town to hold their courts, and for a convenient place in the faid town for the keeping their books, papers and records.

IV. And BE IT ENACTED, That all causes, pleas, process and pleadings, which now are, or shall Causes, &c. be depending in Washington county court before the first Monday in December seventeen hundred may be profeand ninety, shall and may be prosecuted as effectually in that court as if this act had not been made; cured, &c. and in cale any deeds or conveyances of land in that part of Washington county now called Allegany county, have been, or shall be before the first Monday in December, seventeen hundred and ninety, acknowledged according to law, the encolment or recording thereof in either of the faid counties, within the time limitted by law, shall be good and available.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the county charge of Washington county, heretofore assessed, Charge to be shall be collected and applied as if this act had not been made.

VI. AND BE ET ENACTED, That the county court and orphans court of Allegany county shall When courts first be held on the first Monday in April, seventeen hundred and ninety-one, and the said county bec. court be afterwards held on the first Mondage in the months of April and September yearly, and the Taid orphans court shall be afterwards held on the fecond Monday in the months of June, August,
