CHAP. XXXVIII. vember, seventeen hundred and eighty nine, leaving many balances of the faid taxes and county rates due and unpaid at the time of his decease; and the faid Thomas Worrell has prayed that he muy be empowered to collect all fuch balances due and unpaid as aforefaid, in the fame manner that his deceased father might have done, when living, in virtue of his said several offices of sheriff and collector; and it appearing to this general assembly that the prayer of the faid petition is highly reaionable,

T. Worrell to collect, &c.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the faid Thomas Worrell be and he is hereby authorifed and empowered to take, demand, collect and receive, the relidue of the public affessments, taxes, dues, sees and demands, and all and every sum and sums of money, or quantity of tobacco, due to the faid Edward Worrell in virtue of his feveral offices of fleriff and collector of the public affeffment, or county rate, for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-nine, in as full and ample a manner as the faid Edward Worrell could have done was he now living, and his feveral offices unexpired; and the faid Thomas Worrell shall be allowed until the first day of October next to complete the collection of the balances aforefaid, and shall be allowed the same commission upon the faid collections that his deceased father would have been entitled to.

Provifo.

III. PROVIDED NEVERTHELESS, That before the faid Thomas Worrell shall proceed to execute the faid office of collector, he shall enter into bond, with such sufficient securities as shall be approved of by the treasurer of the eastern shore, in the sum of five thousand pounds current money, to this state, conditioned for the faithful performance of the trust reposed in him by virtue of this act, and for truly accounting with the feveral persons interested in the collection of the said taxes, fees and charges; and the faid bond shall be recorded among the records of Kent county court, and be afterwards transmitted to the clerk of the general court for the eastern shore, to be there recorded and deposited for safe custody.

Proviso.

IV. AND PROVIDED ALSO, That before the faid Thomas Worrell, or his agent, shall proceed to collect, by execution, any taxes, fees or charges, claimed of any citizen or citizens of the faid county, a full and fair account of fuch taxes, fees or charges, shall be delivered to every such citizen or citizens, for the space of ten days at the least before a demand for payment shall be enforced by the faid collector or his agents; and every fuch account shall be verified by an affidavit of the the faid Thomas Worrell, if he be thereto required by any fuch citizen or citizens, that it does not appear by the books, papers, or other documents of Edward Worrell, late of Kent county, deceased, that the faid account, or any article thereof, hath been paid or fatisfied, and that he doth not know of any payment thereof being made to the faid Edward Worrell, or to any other person for his use, and that he hath not himself received the same, or any part thereof, except so much as shall be credited on the faid account; and if any citizen, of whom fuch taxes, fees or charges, shall be claimed, shall allege that the same hath been paid to any agent or deputy of the said Edward Worrell, it shall be lawful for the faid Thomas Worrell, or other person interested, to cause such agent or deputy to be summoned before a justice of the peace of such county, and to be examined, on oath or affirmation, concerning the truth of fuch allegations.

C H A P. XL.

An ACT to alter the time of holding the court of appeals. Lib.

Preamble.

HEREAS it appears to this general assembly, that the holding of the court of appeals on the first Tuesday in the months of May and October is inconvenient;

When court of appeals is to be held, &c.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the court of appeals to be held on the first Tuesday in May next, shall, by virtue of this act, be held on the second Tuesday in the month of June next; and every appeal and proceeding in the faid court shall be and hereby are continued from the faid first Tuesday in May next until the faid second Tuesday in June next; and every appeal and proceeding now depending in the faid court shall stand in the same state and condition, to all intents and purposes, on the said second Tuesday in June next, as the same would be in on the first Tuesday in May next, if this act had not been made; and the said court to
