B E IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That an act of assembly passed at May session, seventeen hundred and eighty-eight, * entitled, An act to repeal an act, (a) entitled, An act for the relief of insolvent debtors, and to revive another act, † entitled, An act for the relief of insolvent debtors, be and is hereby continued, and shall remain in full force until the thirtieth day of October, seventeen hundred and ninety-six, and until the end of the next session of assembly which shall happen thereafter.

B E IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That an act of assembly, entitled, An act for the relief of insolvent debtors, passed at March session, seventeen hundred and seventy-four, * be and the same is hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force until the thirtieth day of October, seventeen hundred and ninety, and to the end of the next session of assembly which shall happen thereafter.

C H A P. I.

An ACT to enable the judges of the court of appeals to continue certain causes now depending before them. Lib. JG. No. 1. fol. 217.
