C H A. P. XIV. Commissioners to take an oath, &c. VI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That every commissioner to be appointed in pursuance of this act, being fore he shall proceed to execute his office, shall take an oath, or affirmation, before some justice of the peace, that he will diligently and faithfully, according to the best of his judgment, perform the duties of a commissioner of the said town, according to the directions of this act, without favour, partiality or prejudice; and a certificate of such qualification shall be made and returned by such justice of the peace to the said commissioners, to be filed and recorded among their proceedings.

To meet in April, &c.

VII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid commissioners, or the major part of them, shall meer together at the court-house in the said town, or at such other public place within the limits, thereof as shall be previously notified, on the first Monday in April in the ensuing year, and statedly on the first Monday in every third month thereafter, and as much oftener, by adjournment, as they shall judge to be necessary; and when so assembled, the said commissioners, or the major part of them, shall proceed to execute the several powers and authority vested in them by this act, from time to time, as occasions shall require.

And recommend plans, &c.

VIII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid commissioners shall be and they are hereby authorised, empowered and required, to meet as aforefaid, and, from time to time, to recommend fuch plans and regulations as they shall judge beneficial to the town, or the inhabitants thereof; (a) to cause to be removed all nuisances and obltructions that may interrupt the passage of the said inhabitants, or others, in the freets, lanes and alleys, of the faid town; to caule the principal or other freets to be repaired, improved or paved, whenever a majority of the said inhabitants shall reasonably require the same to be done, and sufficient sums of money can be raised, by subscription or otherwise, for this falutary purpose; to cause the inhabitants and others entitled to vote for commissioners according to this act, to be and to continue registered, and to make such alterations in the register thereof, from time to time, as the increasing number of inhabitants, or other changing circumstances, shall render necessary; to appoint and qualify a clerk, whose duty it shall be to keep fair and faithful minutes of their proceedings, in proper and well bound books to be provided by them for that purpole, and to be subject to the inspection and examination of the inhabitants of the said town, and of all persons who may be concerned; to cause the persons entitled to vote as aforesaid to be summoned, by public advertisement, to meet at some certain time and place within the limits of the said town, whenever their fentiments may be requifite upon any extraordinary occasion; to cause a just and fair affessment and valuation of all the property, real and personal, within the limits of the said town, to be made and returned, from time to time, by fome skilful and discreet person, to be appointed and qualified by them for fuch occasion, and whenever it shall be deemed necessary, for any purpose advantageous to the town, by a majority of the voters to be summoned and assembled as aforesaid, to impôse and levy on the property, so directed to be assessed and valued, any sum from the money in equal and fair proportions, (b) provided the money, so to be imposed and levied, shall not exceed; in any one year, the rate of one dollar for every hundred pounds worth of property, according to fuclt respective assessments and valuation, and in the same proportion upon every greater or smaller share of property; to appoint and qualify an active and discreet person annually, to be the bailiff of the faid town, and to give him fuch directions in the execution of his office as shall be necessary to accomplish the intentions of this act; to pay their clerk, and the bailiff of the faid town, respecttively, a reasonable allowance for their services, to be rated by the said commissioners on the property aforefaid by equal affeffments; and, generally, to order and promote fuch regulations and improvements for the benefit and advantage of the faid town, as the faid commissioners, or the inhabitants 医电子分泌性 医电子管 医乳球性精神病性 thereof, shall determine to be necessary.

(a) By 1794, ch. 58, the commissioners are empowered to make regulations with regard to a wharf built at a place called Town Point, and the public road was established down to the said wharf.

(b) By ch. 23, they are empowered to lay a tax on billiard tables and dogs, and to make regulations for the collection, &c. By 1791, ch. 10, they are empowered to make by-laws for the regulation, &c. of the town, and the inhabitants, and to refirm disorders, &c. and are vessed with the same powers that are given to the justices of the peace in any county by the ad of November, 1739, ch. 8, to regulate the affize of bread.

Bailiff to be appointed anunally, &c. IX. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the bailiff of the faid town shall be appointed annually on the first Menday in May, and before he shall proceed to execute his office, he shall take an oath, or affirmation, before the said commissioners, that he will faithfully and impartially perform the duties required of him, as bailiff of the said town, by this act, according to the best of his skill and judgment, and without favour, assection or prejudice; and the duties of the said bailiff shall be to attend the meetings of the said commissioners whenever he shall be required; to perform such services, for more essectively accomplishing the objects of this act, as shall be directed by the said commissioners; to prevent the tumultuous and irregular meetings of slaves, negroes, and other dissolute and disorderly persons, within the limits of the said town, or if so assembled, to disperse them by reasonable and
