XIX.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the justices of the peace of Dorchester and Caroline counties, at their next respective levy courts of said counties, and thereafter annually, shall levy equally on said counties such sum or sums of money, together with the sheriff's commission of six per cent. for collecting the same, on all assessable property in said counties, as shall be found sufficient to keep in good repair and order the said bridge, and road leading over the same; which money, so levied, shall be collected in the same manner, at the same times, and by the same persons, as other county charges and taxes are collected, and shall be paid into the hands of the commissioners aforesaid, or any of them, by the persons so collecting the same, and which money, when so received by the commissioners aforesaid, shall be applied in the manner as intended and directed by this act.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners aforesaid, or a majority of them, shall, within three months after the passage of this act, open and lay out the said road, of reasonable width, which road, when opened and laid out as aforesaid, shall be thereafter deemed and taken to be the public road, and the division of the counties aforesaid, and shall be kept in repair as aforesaid.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That in case of death, resignation, disqualification or refusal to act, of any of the commissioners aforesaid, when such vacancy shall happen, the remaining commissioners shall have power, and they are hereby directed to fill up such vacancies, so that upon filling up the vacancy or vacancies there shall be the aforesaid number of commissioners from each county respectively, as intended by this act; and such remaining commissioners shall meet at the bridge aforesaid within fifteen days after such vacancy or vacancies shall happen, and fill up said vacancy or vacancies, and such re-appointment shall and may be as often as occasion may require, until the road shall be open and laid out, and made fully complete, as is hereby directed.

VI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the inhabitants of that part of Dorchester county which by this act is taken away from said county and added to Caroline county, shall have, hold and enjoy, all such rights and privileges as are held and enjoyed by the inhabitants of Caroline county aforesaid.

VII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That from and after the passage of this act, so much of the law, entitled, An act for the division of Dorchester and Queen-Anne's counties, and for erecting a new one by the name of Caroline, passed in the year of seventeen hundred and seventy-three, \* as has relation to the divisional line of said counties, hereby altered and established as by this act is directed, shall be and is hereby repealed.

C H A P. XX.

An ACT to direct the mode of prosecution in certain cases. Lib.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this act, all persons offending against any act or acts of the assembly of this state, which acts direct the mode of prosecution to be by action of debt, bill, plaint or information, or by bill, plaint or information, shall and may be prosecuted by bill of indictment, or action of debt, and not by bill, plaint or information, any thing in any of the said acts to the contrary notwithstanding.

C H A P. XXI.

An ACT supplementary to an act, (a) entitled, An act for the more effectual paving the streets of Baltimore-town, in Baltimore county, and for other purposes. Lib. JG. No. 1. fol. 586.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That every tax now laid, or that may hereafter be laid, for the paving, repair and improvement, of the streets, lanes and alleys, of Baltimore-town, agreeably to, and in conformity with, the powers vested in the special commissioners, shall and may be recovered by distress and sale of so much of the property of the person or persons chargeable therewith, as shall be sufficient to satisfy and pay the sum or sums with which they shall be respectively rated and charged; and the person appointed to collect the said taxes, and make dis-
