C H A P. XXVII.

IX. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the streets aforesaid shall not be extended or opened through the property of any individual injured thereby, until the damages by them sustained, and assessed as aforesaid, shall be first paid, or secured to be paid to their satisfaction, together with legal interest thereon from the time of ascertaining the damages by them respectively sustained.

C H A P. XXXI.

An ACT for dividing All-Saint parish, in Montgomery, Frederick, Washington and Allegany counties, and for erecting a parish out of the same, called by the name of Saint-Peter's Parish. Lib. JG. No. 1. fol. 599.

BE IT ENACTED, That from and after the first day of November next, all that part of All-Saints parish, beginning at the mouth of Great Seneca, and running by and with said run to the main road leading from Montgomery court-house, by Basil Robert's, to Frederick-town, then with said road to the ferry on Monocacy, formerly known by the name of Kennedy's Ferry, thence down Monocacy to the mouth of Bennett's creek, thence streight across to Patowmack river where it crosses the Catoctin mountain, thence with the said river to the beginning, shall be separated, constituted and created into a parish, to be called by the name of Saint-Peter's Parish, and is hereby adjudged, deemed and taken, to be a separate and distinct parish, the freeholders empowered to elect vestrymen and churchwardens, and to build and found a church therein, and to have, hold and enjoy, all privileges and advantages that are held and enjoyed by any other parish in this state.

C H A P. XXXII.

A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act to empower the justices of Caroline county to levy a sum of money, by an assessment of the property of said county, to erect a gaol at Denton, in said county, and for other purposes therein mentioned. Lib. JG. No. 1. fol. 600.

WHEREAS by the act to which this is a supplement, commissioners were appointed to contract with workmen, and superintend the building a good and sufficient gaol on the public ground at Denton, in said county, and the erecting and making a good and sufficient causeway on the east side of Choptank river, nearly opposite the court-house of said county, and a strong and substantial wharf on the west side of the said river, and the marsh through which the said road is directed to pass, is private property, and the powers of said commissioners are not sufficient to enable them to carry the act into effect; and the said commissioners are unwilling to undertake the discharge of the duties imposed by said act; therefore,

Preamble.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Joseph Richardson, Christopher Driver, William Robinson, Henry Downes and Robert Hardcastle, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners in the room and place of the commissioners appointed in the act to which this a supplement; and the said commissioners shall have full power and authority to open and lay off a road, and make a good and sufficient causeway, through the marsh on the east side of Choptank river, opposite, or as nearly opposite the court-house of said county as they may think best or proper, and erect a wharf at the end of said causeway, if they shall think it necessary; and the said commissioners, or a majority of them, are hereby authorized and empowered to exercise all the other powers granted,
