A Further supplement to an act * respecting the settlers on the reserved lands westward of Fort Cumberland. Lib. JG. No. 1. fol. 690.

Further time
allowed, &c.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That a further time be allowed for payment for the lands valued to settlers westward of Fort Cumberland; and the said settlers may make payment of the balances by them now due, as follows, to wit: One third part of the said balance on or before the first day of May next, one other third part thereof on or before the first day of May, seventeen hundred and ninety-four, and the remaining third part on or before the first day of May, seventeen hundred and ninety-five; provided, that nothing in this act contained shall be construed to affect the rights of any other person or persons, acquired since the first day of May last, to any of the said lots; and provided also, that any person or persons, who have already, or may hereafter, proclaimate any of the said lots, shall pay such composition money thereon as the original settlers were to pay for the same.

By 1793, ch. 62, the time was further extended, on behalf of those who had proclaimed for the original settlers, to the 1st of May, 1794, for one half, and to the 1st of May, 1795, for the remainder.
