VI AND BE IT ENACTED. That no person shall slaughter or butcher any cattle in or near the faid On slaughtermarket house, nor put any horse or other cattle in or under the said market-house, under the penalty ing cattle, &c. of fifteen shillings current money for each offence.

VII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners of the faid market shall appoint a person of A clerk to be good repute and feill to be clerk of the faid market, who may be removed from office by the faid com- appointed, &c. missioners, and the faid commissioners shall, from time to time, supply any vacancy in the office of clerk of the market; and the clerk of the market, before he acts as such, shall take an oath, or affirmation, that he will diligently and faithfully perform the duties of clerk of Charles town market, a certificate of which qualification shall be filed among the proceedings of the said commissioners.

VIII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the clerk of the faid market shall have authority at all times His duty, &c. to take care and charge of the market-house and ground aforesaid, and the market thereof, and to examine and inspect the provisions and market stuff brought thereto for sale, and to try the weight or measure of any provisions or market-stuff made up in parcels, and if the same shall not be found of the weight or measure pretended by the person offering the same for sale, to seize the same, and fell them at public auction at the market-house; and if any provisions or market-stuff be found unfound or unwholesome, to seize and destroy the same, and to try and adjust the weights and measures used at the said market by the standards of the county, and if any be found false or untrue, to seize the fame, and if any can be altered, fo as to be made true, to fell the same at public auction at the market house, or, with the consent and approbation of the faid commissioners, to destroy them, if they be incapable of such alteration, one half of the produce of all such sales to be retained by the clerk of the market for his own use, the other half to be paid by him to the commissioners of the market, for the purposes hereafter mentioned; and if any person shall think him or herself aggrieved by any feisure made by the faid clerk, he or she may, within five days, appeal to the said commissioners, who shall make such order therein as they shall think just.

IX. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid market-house and appertenances shall be and the same Market-house are hereby vested in the faid commissioners, and their successors, for the use of, and in trust for, the vested, &c. faid town; and the clerk of the faid market, under the direction of the faid commissioners, shall have power to rent out the stalls and shambles of the said market-house, and to collect the rents, and shall half yearly give to the faid commissioners a fair account of all monies received by him, and pay all fuch fums as may be due by him to the commissioners aforesaid:

X. AND BE IT ENACTED, That if any person reliding in said town shall hereafter suffer any goat, Goats, &c. not hog or goofe, to go at large in the faid town, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of ten shillings current to go at large, money for every fuch goat, hog or goofe, fuffered fo to go at large.

XI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That it shall be the duty of the clerk of the market, and of all con- Clerk, &c. to stables of Charles county, to give information to a justice of Charles county of any breach of this give informalaw that may come to their knowledge, and that all fines imposed by this act shall be recovered before a fingle magistrate, the one half to the use of the informer, the other half to be paid to the said commissioners.

XII. AND BE IT ENACTED, .. That all monies that may be received by the commissioners aforesaid How monies in virtue of this law, shall be applied to the following purposes, in the order following: First, to are to be applied make a reasonable compensation, not exceeding ten pounds per year, to the clerk of the market, for his fervices; fecondly, to making any necessary repairs or imprevements to the market-house or ground; thirdly, to reimburse, in due proportion, such persons who voluntarily contribute to building the faid market-house; and the surplus, if any, shall be paid by the faid commissioners to the of the justices, who may lay the levy for Charles county; and the said commissioners shall annually lay their accounts and proceedings before the county court of Charles county, and the fame shall be filed in the proceedings of the said court.
