II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore Treasurer to fhall and he is hereby authorifed and required to pay the several persons, their executors, adminis- pay, &c. trators, assigns or orders, or to such of them as shall offer to receive the same, the several sums of current money allowed to them respectively, as they appear to be settled and ascertained by the said journal of accounts, out of any money now in the treasury, or that shall come into the treasury, subject to the appropriation of the general assembly.
