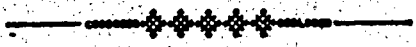


XV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That in all appointments of trustees under this act by the chancellor, in the room of any person before appointed, the chancellor shall consult the creditors, and govern himself by the choice of a majority of them in value, unless upon notice being given by public advertisement, or in such other manner as he shall think reasonable, the said creditors shall neglect to make such choice. C H A P. LXXII. Creditors to be consulted, &c.

XVI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That none of the said debtors, who do not make application as Time limited. aforesaid on or before the first day of April next, shall have any benefit of this act.



At a SESSION of the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of MARYLAND, 1795. begun and held at the City of ANNAPOLIS, on Monday, the 2d of November, and ended the 24th day of December, 1795, the following laws were enacted.

C H A P. I.

An ACT to settle and ascertain the salary of the members of the council for the ensuing year. Passed 24th of Dec. 1795.

C H A P. II.

An ACT to enable the court of appeals to continue certain causes.
Lib. JG. No. 2. fol. 271.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the court of appeals, now sitting, be Court may continue causes. and they are hereby authorized to continue any cause depending in the said court until and during June term next which they may think proper, in order for a hearing on the merits between the parties, and not for delay.

C H A P. III.

An ACT for the destruction of crows. Lib. JG. No. 2. fol. 271.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That if any person residing in Anne-Arundel, Persons to be allowed, &c. Prince-George's, Charles, Dorchester or Calvert counties, shall bring to any justice of the peace of the county in which such person shall reside, the head or heads of any crow or crows, such person shall, for every such head, be allowed; in the county levy of the said county, the sum of six-pence current money; and the justice of the peace before whom such head or heads shall be brought is hereby required to give the person bringing the same a certificate thereof, and cause the said head or heads to be burnt, or otherwise destroyed.

II. PROVIDED NEVERTHELESS, AND BE IT ENACTED, That no person whatsoever shall be entitled Proviso. to any allowance for any such head or heads, without first making oath, that such crow or crows was or were killed in the county where such certificate is applied for, and that no certificate hath been obtained from any other justice of the peace for the same.

III. This act to continue and be in force till the thirtieth day of January, seventeen hundred and Duration. ninety-eight.
