Presmble.

THEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by the petition of Robert Buchanan, Simon Wilmer, of Edward, and Henry Curry, that they became fecurities for Thomas Jones, deceased, collector of the taxes and county rates for Kent county for the year seventeen hundred and ninety-five, and that the faid Thomas Jones died before his time for collection had expired, leaving many balances of the faid taxes and county rates uncollected, for the payment of which balances they, as securities of the said Thomas Jones, are liable; and the said Robert Buchanan, Simon Wilmer, of Edward, and Henry Curry, have prayed that they may be empowered to collect all balances due and uncollected as aforefaid, in the fame manner that the faid Thomas Jones decealed, might have done when living, in virtue of his faid office of collector; and it appearing to this general affembly that the prayer of the faid petition is highly reasonable,

R. Buchanan, &c. may collect,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the faid Robert Buchanan, Simon Wilmer, of Edward, and Henry Curry, or any two of them, be and they are hereby authorifed and empowered to collect, on or before the first day of October next, all balances owing as aforesaid to the faid deceased collector, in manner following, to wit: That the aforesaid Robert Buchanan, Simon Wilmer, of Edward, and Henry Curry, or any two of them, or some person or persons authorised by them, or any two of them, in the collection aforesaid, deliver to the person charged, or leave at his or her place of abode, an account, stating the taxes or county rates, or such part thereof as may be claimed as due, and if the person or persons owing such taxes or county rates shall neglect or resuse to pay the same, it shall and may be lawful for the said Robert Buchanan, Simon Wilmer, of Edward, and Henry Curry, or any two of them, or fuch person or persons as may be authorised by them, or any two of them, to collect the same by execution or distress of property of the person or persons so resuling or neglecting, and to sell and dispose thereof at public auction at the expiration of five days, exclusive of the day of seizure and day of sale.

By a supplement, ch. 8, the said Robert Buchanan, &c. are entitled to the same commission on their collections as collectors

Preamble.

HEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by the petitions of Thomas Bond and Henry Richardson, securities for Thomas Gibson, late sheriff of Harsord county, deceased, and Thomas Ringgold and Michael Corfe, fecurities for Thomas Jones, late sheriff of Kent county, deceased, that the respective sheriss for whom they became securities have died before they could complete their collections of officers fees, and amerciaments due to the state, in the counties aforefaid, and have prayed that a law may pass, authorising them to complete the said collections, and it appearing reasonable to this general assembly; therefore,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the faid Thomas Bond and Henry may collect, &c. Richardson, or the survivor of them, and the faid Thomas Ringgold and Michael Corfe, or the survivor of them, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to collect, on or before the first day of October next, all balances of officers fees, and amerciaments due to the state, which were put into the hands of the faid deceafed sheriffs respectively to be collected for the year seventeen
