IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That from and after the first day of May next aforesaid, if any person Or sell out of shall fell, or cause to be fold, any article of provision, upon market-days and during market-hours, at market, &c. any other place than in the market-house, or on the ground aforesaid, such person shall forseit and pay the sum of fifteen shillings current money for each and every offence.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That all fines imposed by this act shall be recovered before a single ma- How fines are gistrate, the one half to the informer, the other half shall be retained by the magistrate, and be by to be recovered, him accounted for and paid to the justices of the levy court of said county at their annual meeting.

VI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That all monies that may be received by the justices of the levy court And monies in virtue of this act, or so much as they may think necessary, shall be applied to making any necesfary repairs or improvements to the faid market-house and ground.

VII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That this act shall be in force for the term of two years, and until Duration. the end of the next session of assembly that shall happen thereaster.

C H A P. XIX.

An ACT to survey, continue and extend, certain streets in Thomas Dec. 1795. Beall, of George's, addition to George-town, in Montgomery county. Lib. JG. No. 2. fol. 289.

WHEREAS Thomas Sim Lee, Thomas Turner, George Magruder, William H. Dorsey, Tho- Preamble, mas Beall, of George, Stephen B. Balch, Thomas Clarke, Andrew White, James Simpson, Samuel Turner, junior, Francis Lowndes and Uriah Forrest, inhabitants of George-town, and the additions thereto, in Montgomery county, have, by their petition to this general assembly, prayed for the continuation of Gay-street, Dumbarton-street, Beall's-street, West-street and Back-street, in Thomas Beall, of George's, addition to George-town, to interfect High-street in Beatty and Hawkin's addition to George-town, and to continue Congress-freet until it shall intersect Eighth-street in Beatty and Hawkin's addition to George-town aforefaid, as a measure of great public utility and convenience; and it appearing to this general affembly, that to extend and continue the faid fireets. will greatly contribute to the convenience of the inhabitants, and to the regularity of the town; therefore,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That John Templeman, Francis Lowndes Commissioners and John Threlkeld, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners, and they, or a majority of appointed, &c. them, are hereby authorised and required, at sometime before the first day of August next, to cause the aforesaid Gay-street, Dumbarton-street, Beall's-street, West-street and Back-street; in Thomas Beall, of George's, addition to George-town, to be surveyed, laid off and continued, of their prefent width, in streight lines, until they shall severally intersect High-street continued in Beatty and Hawkin's addition aforesaid, and to continue Congress-street and Eighth-street in Beatty and Hawkin's addition to George-town aforefaid until they shall interfect each other.

III. And BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners aforesaid, or a major part of them, shall, on or Who shall cause before the first day of August next, cause a correct and accurate survey and plot to be made of said made for streets, and the respective lots, pieces or parcels of ground, through which they shall pass, certified under the hands and seals of the said commissioners, or a major part of them; and the said plot shall be recorded amongst the records of the territory of Columbia as soon as conveniently may be thereafter, there to remain as evidence of the location of faid streets, which several streets, so to be laid out in purfuance of this act, shall be highways, and be so deemed and taken to all intents and purpoles whatloever; provided nevertheless, that the corporation of George-town, when in commonhall affembled, or a majority of them, are hereby vested with full power and authority, immediately
