C H A P. XXXVII.

An additional supplementary act to the act, * entitled, An act for the marking of highways, and making the heads of rivers, creeks, branches and swamps, passable for horse and foot. Lib. JG. No. 2.

tol. 318. WHEREAS the act, entitled, An act for the marking of highways, and making the heads of Preamble. thereto, authorife the overfeers of the highways to cut down trees of a certain description for the making of and repairing bridges over the heads of rivers, creeks, branches, fwamps, or other low and miry places, and no provision being made by any of the said acts for making the proprietors of the same any compensation therefor, therefore,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That any person whose trees or wood Persons to be shall be cut down or used for the purpose of making or repairing bridges, by the overseers of the compensated, roads, in virtue of the act, entitled, An act for the marking of highways, and making the heads of rivers, creeks, branches and fwamps, passable for horse and foot, and the supplementary acts thereto, Shall have full compensation for the same from the county or counties in which the same shall be uled, the value of which shall be afcertained on oath of the overleer or overfeers under whose direction the fame shall be cur down or used, or such other testimony as the levy court shall require, to be by him or them returned to their respective levy courts, at their next meeting after such bridges or repairs shall be made.

HI. AND BE IT ENACTED. That if any overfeer or overfeers of any road or roads, under whose Penalty on odirection any trees or wood shall be cut down or used in virtue of the act aforesaid, shall not make verseers for not return of the value of the fame, as by this act is directed, he shall pay the value of the trees or wood fo cut down or used to the proprietor of the same, to be recovered by action of debt, or on the case to recover damages, as if the fame were due on contract, and the county shall be exonerated from the fame.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the feveral levy courts to whom such return shall be made are Value to be lehereby authorised and required to levy the same on the assessable property of their respective counties, to be included in the county tax of faid counties, for the use of the proprietors of said trees or wood, and to be paid over to them by the collector thereof.

V. Ann, whereas doubts have arisen whether overleers of the roads are compelled to keep the bridges, which are or may be erected over creeks or runs, clear of trees, traffi or gravel, which may lodge against or near them so as to obstruct the passage of the water, Be it enacted, That it shall Overseers to rebe the duty of overleers of the roads to remove all trees, traft or gravel, which may lodge against move trees, &c. or near any bridge which is or may be erected over any creek or run to as to obstruct the passage of the water, under the penalty of five pounds current money for every fuch neglect.

VI. And, whereas doubts have arisen what description of persons are intended to work on the public roads, under the existing laws to which this is a supplement, BE IT ENACTED, That every Who are subable bodied male person shall be and is hereby made subject to the like personal services, and to in- jest to personal cur the like penalties, in the same manner that labourers are in the aforesaid recited acts; provided, that every fuch person may, at his option, in the discharge of the duties aforesaid, pay to the overfeer of the road the fum of three shillings and nine-pence current money per day, for every day he shall be called upon to labour on the public roads, to be employed by him in procuring labourers to work upon the road, and it shall be the duty of the overfeer annually to account with the levy court of his county for all sums of money which he shall receive in virtue of this act.
