C H A P. XL.

An ACT for altering the time of holding the orphans court in Worcester county. Lib. JG. Passed 24th of No. 2. fol. 321.

An ACT to enable the vestrymen of the parish of Saint-James, in Anne-Arundel county, for the time being, to fell a tract of land therein mentioned, and to apply the money arising by such sale towards the purchase of another tract or parcel of land, to be made a glebe for the use of the rector of that parish, and his successors. Lib. IG. No. 2. fol. 322.

WHEREAS the rector and vestry of the parish of Saint-James, in Anne-Arundel county, have Preambles flet forth, in their petition to the general affembly; that a certain tract of land called Wrighton, being the glebe-land of faid parish, is so remotely situate from the church that great inconvenience refults therefrom, as well to the rector of the parish as to the parishioners, and have prayed that an acl may pala, empowering them to fell the faid land, and with the money arifing from the fale thereof to purchase other land more conveniently situate to the church; and this general assembly

deeming it expedient that a law to that effect should pass, therefore,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the vestrymen, or the major part of Vestry to sell a them, for the time being, of the parille of Saint-James, in Anne-Arundel county, be and they are trad of land, hereby authorised and empowered, within twelve months from the passage of this law, to expose to fale, at public auction, first giving two months notice in the Maryland Gazette of the day of fuch fale, a certain tract or parcel of land, fituate, lying and being in the faid parish, commonly called Wrighton, and which hath been and now is the glebe-land of faid parish, and to execute and acknowledge conveyances in fee-simple to the person or persons who may or shall be the highest bidder for the faid land, upon the whole of the purchase money being paid to them, the said vestrymen, for the time being, or the major part of them, and not before.

M. And he it enacted, That the faid vestrymen, or a major part of them, for the time being, And purchase may and shall apply the money arising from the sale of the said tract or parcel of land called Wrigh- another, &c. ton towards the purchase of another tract or parcel of land, lying in some more central part of the faid parish, and more convenient to the church; and the faid xestrymen for the time being, or a major part of them, are hereby authorifed and empowered to take a conveyance, in fee-simple, to them and their fuccessors, of such land so by them purchased, and to hold the same in trust and for the use and benefit of the rector of the said parish, and his successors, for ever-

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That in case the said vestrymen, or the major part of them, shall not, Or place the in fix months after fuch fale made by them as before directed, be able to purchase some other tract money out to or parcel of land more central to the parish, and more convenient to the church; then the faid interest, &c. vestrymen, or the major part of them, are hereby empowered and directed to place the money arising from the fale aforefaid out to interest, upon such fecurity as they, or the major part of them, in their differetion, may deem good and fufficient, which interest shall be yearly paid to the rector of the parish for the time being, until the purchase as aforesaid can be made, which it is hereby declared to be the duty of the faid vestrymen to make as soon as they possibly can, with a view of answering the beneficial object contemplated by this act.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That in case the land which may or shall be purchased by the said Stock to be purvostrymen, in virtue of the power and authority vested in them by this act, shall not amount in price chaled, &c. to the full sum which the faid vestrymen may or shall receive for the afore-mentioned glebe-land called Wrighton, then the faid yestrymen are hereby authorised and directed to purchase, with the furplus money that may remain in their hands, three per cent. Itock in the funds of the United States, and to receive the interest and dividends that may accrue due on the said three per cent. slock so by
