II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the fattl Charles Hodson be and he is hereby authorised and empowered to take, demand, collect and receive, all and every sum or sums of money, quantity or quantities of tobacco, county rates and officers fees, due him as flieriff and collect, &c. collector aforesaid for the year seventeen hundred and ninety-four, in the same manner as he might have done were his feveral offices unexpired; and the faid Charles Hodfon shall be allowed until the eighteenth day of October next to complete the collection of the balances aforefaid, and shall-be allowed the same commission upon the said collections that he would have been entitled to had his feveral offices been unexpired.

III. PROVIDED ALWAYS, AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid Charles Hodson, or some person Provisor or persons authorised by him, shall, at least ten days before the execution or distress of property for the balances aforesaid, deliver to the person charged, or leave at his or her place of abode, a proved account, stating the taxes and the amount of fees, or fuch part thereof as may be claimed as due, together with all payments that may have been in any manner made by fuch person, and shall give at least five days notice, by advertisement at the most public places in the neighbourhood, of the time and place of sale in case of such execution or distress; and provided also, that all the books of the faid Charles Hodson, and his deputies, in which his accounts as sheriss and collector are stated and kept, shall be deposited in the hands of some person in the county town of the county aforesaid, to be inspected and examined by any person or persons who shall apply for the same, in order to ascertain any payments that may have been made upon his or their account.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore of Treasurer to this state be and he is hereby authorised and directed to subscribe, in behalf of this state, forty subscribe, &c. shares in the augmented capital of the Patowmack company, and to pay the sum of five hundred and seventy-seven dollars and seventy-eight cents on each of said shares; and the said treasurer shall receive the proportion of tolls which shall from time to time be due to the state for faid shares, and the faid treasurer shall have a right to vote for faid shares in person, or by proxy appointed by him.

H. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the treasurer shall not subscribe for any share in the said company But not until until the president thereof shall notify to him, in writing, that the whole of the residue of the said notified, &c. shares are subscribed for; and the payment of the shares subscribed for by the treasurer shall be made at the times and in the proportion required of the individual stockholders in the said augmented

By ch. 89, unless the president and directors shall dispose of fixty shares of the augmented capital for one hundred and fixty pounds sterling each, they shall have no authority to receive from the treasurer a subscription for any part thereof, nor for any payment but in proportion as the other subscribers shall pay, nor till the president and directors shall certify to the treasurer that the preceding inflatments have been paid on every flure of faid augmented capital.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That Messieurs Joshua Prideaux, Edward Commissioners Henry, George Purnell, William Purnell and Littleton Robins, be and they are hereby appointed appointed, &c. commissioners; and the said commissioners, or a majority of them, are hereby authorised to open and clear, at least twenty feet wide, the faid roads, in the manner following, viz. The faid first mentioned road from the faid Locust landing to intersect the road leading from Snow Hill to Philadelphia, and the faid last mentioned road from the said William Davis's shop to the said Cornelius Ennis's landing, and the faid roads, so opened and cleared, (after the valuation herein after directed to be made, or the damages herein after directed to be affessed, shall be paid, or secured to the indi-
