

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the said Charles Hodson be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to take, demand, collect and receive, all and every sum or sums of money, quantity or quantities of tobacco, county rates and officers fees, due him as sheriff and collector aforesaid for the year seventeen hundred and ninety-four, in the same manner as he might have done were his several offices unexpired; and the said Charles Hodson shall be allowed until the eighteenth day of October next to complete the collection of the balances aforesaid, and shall be allowed the same commission upon the said collections that he would have been entitled to had his several offices been unexpired.

III. PROVIDED ALWAYS, AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said Charles Hodson, or some person or persons authorized by him, shall, at least ten days before the execution or distress of property for the balances aforesaid, deliver to the person charged, or leave at his or her place of abode, a proved account, stating the taxes and the amount of fees, or such part thereof as may be claimed as due, together with all payments that may have been in any manner made by such person, and shall give at least five days notice, by advertisement at the most public places in the neighbourhood, of the time and place of sale in case of such execution or distress; and provided also, that all the books of the said Charles Hodson, and his deputies, in which his accounts as sheriff and collector are stated and kept, shall be deposited in the hands of some person in the county town of the county aforesaid, to be inspected and examined by any person or persons who shall apply for the same, in order to ascertain any payments that may have been made upon his or their account.

C H A P. LI.

An ACT for enlarging the capital of this state in the Patowmack company. Lib. JG. No. 2. fol. 337.

A Supplement, ch. 89.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore of this state be and he is hereby authorized and directed to subscribe, in behalf of this state, forty shares in the augmented capital of the Patowmack company, and to pay the sum of five hundred and seventy-seven dollars and seventy-eight cents on each of said shares; and the said treasurer shall receive the proportion of tolls which shall from time to time be due to the state for said shares, and the said treasurer shall have a right to vote for said shares in person, or by proxy appointed by him.

Treasurer to subscribe, &c.

II. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the treasurer shall not subscribe for any share in the said company until the president thereof shall notify to him, in writing, that the whole of the residue of the said shares are subscribed for; and the payment of the shares subscribed for by the treasurer shall be made at the times and in the proportion required of the individual stockholders in the said augmented capital.

But not until notified, &c.

By ch. 89, unless the president and directors shall dispose of sixty shares of the augmented capital for one hundred and sixty pounds sterling each, they shall have no authority to receive from the treasurer a subscription for any part thereof, nor for any payment but in proportion as the other subscribers shall pay, nor till the president and directors shall certify to the treasurer that the preceding instalments have been paid on every share of said augmented capital.

C H A P. LII.

An ACT authorizing the laying out certain roads in Worcester county. Lib. JG. No. 2. fol. 338.

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by the petition of sundry inhabitants of Worcester county, that the laying out a road from the Locust landing to intersect the main road leading from Snow Hill to Philadelphia, as also another road from William Davis's shop to Cornelius Ennis's landing, would be of general public advantage;

Preamble.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Messieurs Joshua Prideaux, Edward Henry, George Purnell, William Purnell and Littleton Robins, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners; and the said commissioners, or a majority of them, are hereby authorized to open and clear, at least twenty feet wide, the said roads, in the manner following, viz. The said first mentioned road from the said Locust landing to intersect the road leading from Snow Hill to Philadelphia, and the said last mentioned road from the said William Davis's shop to the said Cornelius Ennis's landing, and the said roads, so opened and cleared, (after the valuation herein after directed to be made, or the damages herein after directed to be assessed, shall be paid, or secured to the individuals.
