also for every such neglect to keep the same in good repair, forfeit a sum not exceeding fifty dollars, to be recovered in Prince-George's county court aforefaid by action of debt, the one half to the use of the informer, the relidue to be applied to the use of the state of Maryland.

X. PROVIDED ALWAYS, That nothing in this act contained shall be construed or taken in any Proviso. manner to interfere with the jurisdiction which congress may hereafter assume in the territory of Columbia.

WHEREAS it has been represented to this general assembly, by the memorial of James Wilson, Preamble. Samuel Hughes, Gabriel Christie, Mark Pringle, Gideon Denison, John Hall and John Lee Gibson, in behalf of themselves, and others, that at a meeting of a number of gentlemen from the counties of Cumberland, Lancaster, York, Dauphin, Misslin, Huntingdon and Northumberland, in the state of Pennsylvania, and from the counties of Cæcil and Harford in Maryland, held at Harrifburgh, on the twelfth day of August last, resolutions were entered into for the purpose of removing the obstructions and improving the navigation of the bed of the river Susquehanna, and that exertions to effect the purport of faid resolutions are now making, and that it will be greatly forwarded and promoted by a lottery, fanctioned by the legislature; for raising the sum of fifty thousand dollars, therefore praying that a lottery for raifing the above fum, for the above purpose, may be allowed: And whereas it is further represented by the faid memorialists, that they are possessed of parts of two tracts of land, called Convenience and Brother's Lot, adjoining the faid town of Havre-de-Grace, which they are defirous of laying out into lots, and annexing the same to the said town; and the general assembly, considering that the objects embraced by the said memorial are right, reafonable, and of great public utility, therefore,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners of the town of Land to be sur-Havre-de-Grace, in Harford county, or the major part of them, be authorised and required, at any veyed, &c. time before the first day of June next, to cause the aforesaid two tracts or parcels of land to be surveyed and laid out into lots, streets, lanes and alleys, at the cost and expence of the said James Wilfon, Samuel Hughes, Gabriel Christie, Mark Pringle, Gideon Denison, John Hall and John Lee Gibson, in such manner as to the said commissioners, or a major part of them, shall seem conven nt and proper.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners aforesaid, or a major part of them, shall, on And a plot to or before the faid first day of June next, cause a correct and accurate survey and plot to be made of be made, &c. the faid land, and of all the lots, streets, lanes and alleys, which shall be laid out in virtue of this act, and the faid plot shall be recorded among the records of faid county as foon as conveniently may be thereafter, there to remain as evidence of the boundaries, fituation and location, of the faid lots, and of the faid streets, lanes and alleys, which faid streets, lanes and alleys, hereafter to be laid out in pursuance of this act, shall be highways, and shall be so deemed and taken to all intents and purpofes whatfoever; and when the same shall be done, the faid land, so surveyed and laid out, shall be, and is hereby declared to be, part of the fown of Havre-de-Grace, as fully and amply as if included originally therein, and shall have the same immunities and privileges as the rest of the faid town now has, or by former laws ought to have, faving to the state of Maryland, and all bodies politic and corporate, and all persons not mentioned in this act, their several and respective rights.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the aforefaid James Wilson, Samuel Hughes, Gabriel Christie, Any scheme Gideon Denison, John Hall and John Lee Gibson, or a majority of them, be and they are hereby may be proauthorifed and required, to propose and carry into effect any scheme of a lottery, for the purpose of railing a fum of money not exceeding fifty thousand dollars, and to dispose of the tickets in such lottery, and to make all necessary arrangements and regulations respecting the manner and time of drawing and completing the same; provided, that before the sale shall be made of any ticket in virtue of this authority, the faid James Wilson, Samuel Hughes, Gabriel Christic, Gideon Denison, John Hall and John Lee Gibson, or such majority of them as shall undertake to act, shall give bond to the state, with good and sufficient security, to be approved of by the chief justice, or one of the affociate justices, of Harford county court, in the penalty of forty thousand pounds current meney, Dddd 2
