

C H A P. LXXXIX.
In certain cases president, &c. not to call on the treasurer, &c.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That unless the president and directors aforesaid shall dispose of sixty shares of the said augmented capital for the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds sterling each share, they shall have no authority to call for or receive from the treasurer of this state any subscription for any part of the said augmented capital, which by the said act he is authorized to subscribe, nor for any payment of the said subscription; but in the same proportion as the other subscribers to the said augmented capital shall from time to time pay and advance to the said president and directors the amount of their respective subscriptions, nor until the said president and directors shall certify to the said treasurer, under their hands, that the preceding instalments have been paid on every share of said augmented capital.

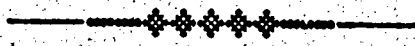
An ACT for the payment of the journal of accounts. Lib. JG. No. 2. fol. 404.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it appears by the journal of accounts of this session, that there is now due from this state the sum of seven thousand six hundred and forty-six pounds ten shillings and threepence current money,

Treasurer to pay, &c.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore shall and he is hereby authorized and required to pay the several persons, their executors, administrators, assigns or orders, or to such of them as shall offer to receive the same, the several sums of current money allowed to them respectively, as they appear to be settled and ascertained by the said journal of accounts, out of any money now in the treasury, or that shall come into the treasury, subject to the appropriation of the general assembly.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Thomas Elliott, David Porter, Thomas Cole, Levin Hall, Daniel Howland, John Snider, Joseph White, Tobias Stansbury, Peter Sharp, and others, have formed themselves into a society, with the charitable view of affording relief to the distressed widows and orphans of members of the said society, and for other laudable purposes they have prayed an act of incorporation; and the legislature being desirous of promoting such benevolent and humane undertakings, have granted the same; therefore,

Persons incorporated, &c.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Thomas Elliott, David Porter, Thomas Cole, Levin Hall, Daniel Howland, John Snider, Joseph White, Tobias Stansbury, Peter Sharp, and others that now are or may hereafter become subscribers and contributors to the said corporation herein erected, and may be admitted into the said corporation agreeable to the rules and by-laws of the same, and their successors, are hereby declared to be one community, corporation and body
