body politic, for ever, by the name of The Charitable Marine Society of Baltimore, and by the same name they and their fuccessors shall and may have perpetual succession, and shall and may at all times hereafter be perfons able and capable in law to purchase, take, have and enjoy, to them and their fuccessors, in fee, or less estate or estates, any lands, tenements, rents, annuities, chattels, bank flock, registered debt, or other public securities within this state, by the gift, bargains, sale or devile, of any person or persons, bodies politic or corporate, capable to make the same, and the same at their pleasure to alien, sell, transfer or lease, in such manner as they may judge most conducive to the benevolent and charitable uses of said society; provided nevertheless, that the said corporation or body politic shall not, at any one time, hold or possess property, real, personal or mixed, exceeding in total value the fum of twenty thousand pounds current money.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the members of faid corporation, and their successors, may meet Corporation to together on the twenty-fixth day of June, in the year of our Lord seventeen hundred and ninety- meet, &c. seven, at Baltimore-town, and on the same day, annually for ever thereafter, or as soon after as may be, and then and there elect the officers of faid fociety, and form such rules and regulations as may be necessary for assuring and carrying into effect the benevolent purposes of this act, provided fuch rules and regulations be not repugnant to the constitution and laws of this or the United States.

IV. And BE IT ENACTED, That all appointments of officers for faid fociety heretofore made by Appointments the members thereof in their private capacities, shall respectively continue and be of full force until to continue, &c. the time specified by this act for the first election of officers for said body corporate.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid corporation, and their successors, by the name aforesaid, Corporation shall be for ever hereafter able and capable in law to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, answer may sue, &c. and be answered unto, defend and be defended, in all or any courts of justice, and before all or any judges, officers or persons whatsoever, in all and singular actions, matters and demands whatsoever, and that it shall and may be lawful for them, and their successors, for ever hereafter, to have a common seal for their use, and the same, at the will and pleasure of them and their successors, to change, alter, break and make anew, from time to time, as they shall think best, and shall in general have and exercise all such rights, franchises, privileges and immunities, as by law are incident and necessary to corporations of this kind, and which may be necessary to the corporation herein and hereby constituted and erected, to enable them duly and fully, in the law, to execute all thingstouching and concerning the defign and intent of their faid incorporation, for the benevolent fuccour and relief of the widows and orphans of members of the faid fociety, agreeable to fuch rules and by-laws as may be established by faid society.

C H A P.

An ACT to confirm certain proceedings of the levy court of Cæcil county, and to enable said court to lay further taxes for the support of the poor of said county. Lib. JG. No. 2. fol. 414.

WHEREAS it is represented by the levy court and trustees of the poor of Cacil county, that Preamble, the sums of money heretofore raised in said county for the support of the poor have been inlufficient;

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the levy court of faid county be and Money to be they are hereby authorised and empowered to sevy annually on the assessable property of said county, levied, &c. fuch fum of money as they shall find necessary for the support of the poor thereof, not exceeding five shillings current money on every hundred pounds of property as aforesaid in said county, together with the collector's commission of fix per cent, for collecting the same.
